



FROM THE K-12 INTERIM PRINCIPAL

We are incredibly lucky as a school to have a student body that is motivated to take action and make change. When our students see room for improvement on our campus, in the community, in our country, and in the world they do more than talk, they act. This spirit of action can be seen in both buildings as students work to organize service projects with the goal of helping others. We have students beginning on Level I up through the high school who are collecting and delivering toys, books, clothes, food, and supplies to people in need. They volunteer in their communities and share their talents with others. They don't just talk, they do.

The action of our students goes beyond the service aspect of our mission. Several weeks ago Joe Kay and I were approached by Nnenne David, our high school student body president, about increasing opportunities for students to discuss issues that are important to them. Several students had asked Nnenne to seek out a safe forum for difficult conversations about a variety of topics. Specifically, Nnenne mentioned several student groups that were doing valuable work that wanted a chance to share that work with the wider high school community. Following our conversation, Nnenne worked with our Black Students Union (BSU), Gender-Sexuality Alliance (GSA), and Game Change groups to design last Wednesday's Student Awareness Day.

In preparation for the day students designed nine 15 minute sessions targeting issues such as racial profiling, gender inequality, relationship violence, and stereotyping. During the sessions they engaged their peers in exercises that pushed for perspective taking, the careful analysis of situations, and the consideration of influencing factors. The sessions took a number of different formats. In some rooms students participated in skits and in other groups student leaders provided well-researched informational overviews. A number of groups debated topics or pushed students to take a stand on an issue. Our students used experiential techniques to educate their peers, share their perspectives, and engage fellow students with important issues. Students circulated with their Advisory groups from session to session and had the chance to participate in every session.

The feedback about the day was overwhelmingly positive. Students enjoyed the format, valued learning from their peers, and appreciated the time devoted to their concerns. They were pleased that their peers saw a need in the community and took steps to meet it. I'd like to thank our student leaders for all of their hard work in putting together the event and all of the student participants for their cooperation and willingness to come to the sessions with an open mind. Last week was an excellent example of students taking their voice and putting it to work. I'm looking forward to the continuing conversation to future student run initiatives throughout our school. 

What is the Outing Club?

The SSCPS MS Outing Club is a club where everyone in grades 5-8 is a member. It is a parent-designed idea to provide social opportunities for SSCPS Middle School Students. The events are not school sponsored.

Why an Outing Club?
