We are very proud of the work of our alumni and of the work our current students are engaged in. As our students look forward to the upcoming school break, the faculty and administration are having important conversations about what the upcoming school year should offer for students on all levels. For some levels, this conversation is about curriculum, what has worked, what needs to be improved, and what holds strong. At other levels, this conversation is more about programming, what courses should be offered, and what is the best possible course sequence in each of the core subject areas.

The conversation also surrounds our hallmark programming of Projects and Workshops. These courses are what makes us unique. Projects and Workshops provide the pedagogical framework for all of our classes. Inquiry-based and project-based learning are where we see the greatest strides in student growth. Some Projects and Workshops frequently evolve and change to meet the needs of our student population. While others, like the High School Art and Music Workshops, remain more constant. As we have experienced some enrollment growth, so too have we experienced growth in our course offerings. These past two years have seen some exciting additions to our Projects and Workshop courses.

One of the most recent additions to our Workshops is the High School Mock Trial. Now in its second year, the Mock Trial Workshop provides our students the opportunity to learn and practice elements of litigation including how to prepare for a case. In Mock Trial, each team is assigned one side of a case and student plays a designated role in preparing for that case. Part of that preparation is learning about both sides of the case and the different approaches to the main issue. In Mock Trial students are able to practice the steps of a trial themselves. They learn how to draft and deliver opening statements and closing arguments. They develop effective techniques for direct and cross examination. And they learn how to research the facts of the case and the issues surrounding the case.







Last week I had the opportunity to watch students present their opening statements addressing the timely issue of the scope of police power in enforcing immigrant action at the border. Students had to introduce the topic, address the relevant statute 8 USC s. 1357, and then present their position. The work is thorough and exhaustive, and clearly, our students love it.

On Friday, March 22, our students traveled to the Massachusetts Bar Association Mock Trial Competition at Faneuil Hall in Boston to watch the finals and plan for next year. Kudos to our students, Benny Anteneh, Seguin Ashley, Shannon Daly, Liam Doherty, DJ Faivre, Gage Kane, Monica Karongo, Lindsay Lamy, Dakota Losee, Drew MacDonald, Maddy Milanoski, John O'Keefe, Grace Ozturk, Jackson Walsh, Afrin Zafar, and their coach Margaret Bulger for a second successful year of working in the Massachusetts Bar Association High School Mock Trial program.
