A Message from Angie



Last Thursday, under the skilled direction of our music teachers, students in grades 5-12 performed in the first night of this year's Winter Wonderland Concert. Students from the middle school Chorus Project, the Concert Band, the High School String Orchestra Workshop, and the High School Music Workshop showcased some of their work from the first part of the school year. Congratulations to our students and to their teachers, Theron Leonard and Kevin Burokas, on a job incredibly well done! As we race to the December break our older students will share music with the larger community on several other occasions including next Friday's Fashion Walk and a holiday performance from the Strings Workshop. These highly anticipated events have become an integral part of the season.



Walking down our hallways this week I could hear our youngest students in their final rehearsals for this evening's K-4 concert. The concert will take place at Hingham High School, 17 Union Street, Hingham. This special event is always well attended and parking can be difficult. Be sure not to park on the street. A map of the parking areas can be found here. We will need cooperation from families in order to create the best possible environment for our students to do their best work and for our families to enjoy it. Please make note of the guidelines below.

The concert begins promptly at 6:00 pm. All K - 4 students should be seated in the auditorium at 6:00. Please schedule time for parking and finding seats when planning your evening. No one is to enter or exit the auditorium while a group is performing unless their child is scheduled to be on stage at that moment. Keeping the door shut helps keep hallway noise out of the performance space.

Kindergarten students will perform first. Before the performance begins kindergarteners are to sit with their families. At 6:00 they will be called to take the stage. After their performance, they will return to sit with their families for the remainder of the concert.

First and second grade students will perform second. We will have a block of seats saved for Level I students on the left hand side of the stage. When first and second grade students arrive at the concert they should sit in the Level I block of seats. When it is time for Level I to sing we will call students up to the stage. They will return to their block of seats following their performance.

Level II students will perform last. We will have a block of student seats reserved on the right hand side of the stage. When third and fourth grade students arrive at the concert they should sit in the Level II block of seats. When it is time for Level II to sing we will call students up to the stage. They will return to their seats following their performance.

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If a family is planning to leave prior to the end of the concert, please plan to leave during transition times. Unless it is an emergency, we ask that families not leave the auditorium during the performance of any group. First and second grade families that need to leave prior to the Level II performance should plan to go up to the Level I student seating section to retrieve their child(ren). Thank you for your cooperation and your continued support of our music program. We are all looking forward to an excellent show!
