For those of you new to SSCPS, our Winter Concerts are an important SSCPS tradition that brings our school community together to celebrate our commitment to student achievement and the arts.

There will be an SSCPS Board of Trustees meeting on Thursday, December 13, 2018. This meeting will review the Charter School End of Year Financial Report that will be submitted to the Massachusetts Department of Education. This report will be voted on at the December meeting. Board of Trustee meetings are open public meetings and all are invited to attend.

The End of Year Financial Report provides significant information regarding charter school funding. At our school we determine our annual budget based upon projections from per pupil tuition. As a regional charter school we receive students from 26 sending districts. While each sending district has a different tuition number, the formula remains the same. This is the "Chapter 70"

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The formula begins with a base, the foundation budget determined by the state. The state makes this determination from student enrollment, a wage adjustment factor, and inflation. State funding is combined with a local contribution from a city or town. The local contribution consists of property taxes, income, and any municipal revenue growth that may be factored into the funding equation. These two income sources make up the per pupil tuition that follows each student into their district public school, vocational school, or charter school. It is this formula that has caused some concern within many public school districts.

The state is aware of the concern that comes with charter school growth and has developed some funding practices in response to public school district concerns. Although the per capita tuition follows the student, the state reimburses each sending district 100 percent of the per capita tuition for the first year of a student's enrollment in the charter school. The state reimburses sending districts 25 percent of the per capita tuition for the next six years. This reimbursement does not occur if a student chooses to attend a vocational school or a private school.

This year our numbers look good. We have increased our faculty and staff and have made decisions to ensure that our student to teacher ratio remains low. We remain committed to the belief that outside of the home a strong teacher has the greatest impact on student achievement.
