As we make our way through March, celebrating Women's History Month, Read Across America, and spring sports, we appreciate the truth in her poetry and all that comes with new beginnings and the anticipation of what is to come.

On Wednesday, March 6, we welcomed 200 new students at the Enrollment Lottery. We could not be happier with all that our new students will bring to our school community. It is appropriate that we hold the lottery as spring approaches. It marks a new beginning for those students representing 26 sending districts, their families, and for our school community as well. Whether the student is an incoming kindergartener or a new high school student, the hope and excitement bring optimism to the new school year.





Level II Celebrates Read Across America Day March 1, 2019

We are humbled to have received over 900 applications from families seeking a new beginning for their students. On lottery day, once again the Great Room at 100 Longwater was filled with prospective families there to witness the process. This year we were once again excited to be able to offer more students seats on all levels.

In the weeks leading up to the enrollment lottery, the Instructional Leadership Team, faculty, and staff reviewed the current educational programming and looked to the future to make some decisions surrounding enrollment and what our students need. Because of the increase in space at 700 Longwater Drive in October, we were able to accept all applicants for the high school during this lottery. Working within the parameters of our growth plan, we know that our increase in enrollment will allow us to increase programming options for our students, including adding a foreign language and transitioning to Pre-AP coursework at the high school.

The enrollment lottery follows all parameters outlined in the <u>Enrollment Policy</u>. We continue to use the growth plan to outline the size and needs of each level. Anticipated openings are determined by the number of students we have in a grade in the current year, the number of students who have indicated they will be returning next year, and then the number of students identified In our growth plan.

In addition to posting the number of anticipated openings, and the number of applications received, we also post the number of applications we receive from each sending district at the lottery. This year we have continued the trend of receiving the highest number of applications from Weymouth (262), the second highest number of applications from Randolph (185), and the third highest number of applications from Brockton (129). Our greatest excitement is the number of siblings who have applied for Kindergarten; 39 applied which means that we were able to accept all siblings and were able to welcome new families as well.



Congratulations Maxine Crays!

Special congratulations to eighth-grade student Maxine Crays on an amazing performance at the regional spelling bee on March 13, held in Lynn, Massachusetts. Maxine competed and won the first two rounds of the regional spelling bee and made it on to the third competition facing tough competition from students statewide. Maxine is now one of the top 60 spellers in Massachusetts. Special thanks to Jennifer Johnson and Kaitlyn Antonowicz for working so hard with our students and organizing our school's first involvement in the National Spelling Bee. We could not be prouder.
