A Message from Angie

Last night we welcomed over 60 families with children entering grades kindergarten through fourth grade to our school at our K-4 Registration and New Family Information Night. The bulk of these new students are entering kindergarteners, the SSCPS class of 2032! Last night's event was one of several this spring intended to ease the transition of new students and their families into our school community. We have had welcome meetings for families at our high school and middle school as well as days for our students new to the older grades to shadow current students. These first interactions with those new to the community help us to make introductions, ease anxieties, and pave the way for new friendships and partnerships.

The focus of our discussion at our New Family Information Night sessions has shifted somewhat in response to feedback from the community. Families new to our school have asked for an opportunity to learn more about the culture of our school. They want to know how our school is different from the other schools their children may have attended in the past and how to navigate those differences. Last night our new families learned some charter speak as we discussed "Levels," "FITs," "Pods," and "EOMs." We discussed the goals of Projects and stressed the importance of relationship building. We invited parents to get involved in our community.



The change in focus of the New Family Information Night is a direct result of the work that our School Council did last year as the group developed the <u>2018-2019 School</u> <u>Improvement Plan</u>. That plan focused our work this year on four major goals. Improve academic performance for all students

- 1. Improve communication with all stakeholders
- 2. Improve the college planning and application process
- 3. Foster a safe welcoming school culture

Each of these goals has several benchmarks that set the standard for meeting that goal. New this year, we are assessing our work toward meeting each of these benchmarks in a twice yearly progress monitoring process. We completed our final

The School Council will be wrapping up the school year at our final meeting tomorrow afternoon. The bulk of our <u>agenda</u> will be dedicated to finalizing the School Improvement Plan for 2019-2020. The meeting will be at 100 Longwater Circle at 3:40 in room 114. We plan to close the voting by 5/31/19 and hand the PA over to the incoming group during our June PA meeting.


