A Message from Angie



We are at the time of year when teachers and students are both busy wrapping up the current school year while planning in earnest for the new year to come. This week is particularly testing heavy as our students in grades 5-8 complete their Math MCAS exams, our Seniors finish up the last final exams of their high school careers, and high school students take their final Advanced Placement exams. End of year field trips and culminating projects are keeping students and teachers busy in both buildings. First and second graders visited the zoo last week, fifth graders performed in an impressive history wax museum, and our kindergarteners will be visiting the South Shore Science Center tomorrow.





Looking ahead, high school students are thinking about schedules for next year. Today students in grades 8-11 are bringing home their course selection forms for 2019-2020. These course assignments are based on a combination of course selection

communicate with families about student schedules. The availability of courses varies by grade; choice increases as students move through the high school. The selections available in ninth grade are relatively narrow as students complete the foundational courses they need for high school success. Seniors have a wide number of courses available to them as they consider what they need to achieve their postsecondary goals.

Significant consideration on the part of both teachers and students went into these course selections. First, we determined what our students are interested in taking and what courses they need for the college majors and the careers they are considering. Students at the high school completed a student interest survey in February. We used this information, combined with student data and college admissions trends to develop our course offerings for next year. Those offerings along with descriptions of the courses, information about prerequisites, and general policies can be found in the 2019-2020 Course Descriptions document. The selections that came home today are not final. There is still time if students would like to make changes. Changes can be made by the guidance department in consultation with the appropriate Curriculum Coordinator.

Our course offerings for the 2019-2020 school year include a significant expansion of the programming available to students. Students will now be able to elect to take French at the high school level, beginning with French I. We will expand the French program each year as students progress through the levels. New elective courses that satisfy core course requirements will also be available to students. Seniors may now choose between British Literature and a new course titled Communication and Connections, a course focused on the importance of communication across a number of areas. A new Nutrition and Fitness science course is now open to Juniors and Seniors.

We have also expanded our Advanced Placement course offerings for next year. Students may now choose to take <u>AP Chemistry</u>, <u>AP Calculus BC</u>, and <u>AP United States History</u> as well as the courses that we have offered for many years. One additional change for 2019-2020 is that our ninth grade courses will now carry a Pre-AP designation. Over the summer ninth grade teachers will be attending Pre-AP training to prepare for this transition. Pre-AP coursework prepares students for Advanced Placement and other college-level courses by emphasizing the literacy, quantitative, and analysis skills students need for college readiness. Teachers will use assessments and performance tasks provided by Pre-AP as they implement the curriculum using SSCPS materials supported by Pre-AP resources. These assessments will provide actionable feedback, allowing teachers to support students in their acquisition of key skills. The goal is to improve the college readiness of all students. Pre-AP courses are designed to be the baseline courses for all students. Every ninth grader will participate in this level of coursework and this is reflected on their course selections.

Please take some time to review the course selections that came home with your child and reach out to make any necessary changes. Thank you for all you do at home to support your children at this busy time of year. I look forward to seeing everyone at our end of year events and celebrations.

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
Thank you all for coming to cast a ballot for all Parents Association positions.

- If there is a dispute or demand for a recount, at least one member of the Election Team (Heidi Aylward, Cliff Peacock, Andrea Poudrier & Ken Poudrier) and one school administrator will be engaged to review or recount parent/guardian submissions.
