Throughout our hallways, you can also see how traditional academics are complemented by student learning in Projects and Workshops. While the Project and Workshop offerings vary somewhat year to year, there are several strands that are traditionally offered at each Level. We have had Projects and Workshops based on art, music, physical fitness/nutrition, theater, and the environment on each Level for many years. Perhaps not surprisingly considering the signs of divisiveness from the world outside of our buildings, a new theme has emerged. Students across campus are focusing their attention on kindness. Two weeks ago Alicia shared the uplifting messages that students in the Level III Dude, Be Nice Project left on the lockers of every K-8 student at 100 Longwater Circle. In a similar initiative, the Better World, Better You Workshop at the high school left positive messages on lockers for their peers at 700 Longwater Drive earlier this fall. Yesterday on Level I students in Tracey's Kindness Club Project celebrated World Kindness day. They carried out their own acts of kindness and encouraged others to take a kindness task to complete from the bulletin board outside of their classroom and to contribute their own ideas to their board. The project will continue through to the Thanksgiving break. Our students are taking the lead to combat negativity and spread positivity to each other.



As emphasized in our <u>Accountability Plan</u>, cross-level work is an important component of Projects and Workshops. Students learn a great deal from older students and from the exercise of teaching younger ones. We are lucky to have

several week unit working with high school students from the Personal Training and Human Performance Workshops. The older students put together a series of challenges for the younger students to complete. They supported the kindergarten students and adjusted their planning to meet their needs. Our older students will continue to have opportunities to get to know our younger students through similar Project and Workshop collaborations throughout the school year.





Thank you to all of the parents that attended last Thursday's Principal's Coffee. At the meeting, I discussed the MCAS score reports that were sent home to the families of students who took the MCAS in grades 3-10 last year. The presentation from the meeting can be found here.
