
Game Change Leadership Award October 10, 2018



In addition to excelling in service and life, we remain committed to student achievement in academics. This week MCAS results are being sent home to families. This is the second year our students took the next-generation MCAS for ELA and Math in grades three through eight. The next-generation MCAS assessments have updated the legacy MCAS, remain specific to Massachusetts, and are taken on a computer.

Tenth-grade students took the legacy MCAS last spring. The legacy MCAS is a paper-based test that has not been modified as much as the next-generation MCAS. The next-generation MCAS is scheduled to be introduced to our current tenth graders this spring. However, because the tenth grade MCAS is a high stakes test, meaning that students must pass in order to receive a high school diploma, the minimum passing score on the next-generation MCAS for tenth graders will not change for at least two years.

The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (ESE) released statewide accountability data on Thursday, September 27, 2018. The release of MCAS data has led to the identification of statewide trends. According to the ESE, statewide approximately half of students in grades three through eight scored *Meeting Expectations* or above. Math has been more complicated and continues to be a statewide focus.

Teachers and administrators have noticed similar trends here at SSCPS. When we review the data, our students are performing at the statewide level in ELA. However, we have noticed that there are some inconsistencies

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instruction. Both next-generation and legacy MCAS provides us with the data to do so, as does the PSAT and DIBELS.

While the ESE has been honing curriculum frameworks and next-generation MCAS, SSCPS continues to make adjustments to the curriculum, classroom instruction, and professional development. The Instructional Leadership Team has taken on much of this effort and has been working closely with our teachers to provide a learning environment where all students succeed and do their individual best.

Please review the *Parent/Guardian Report* sent to you this week. This report provides your child's overall results, an achievement comparison from last year to this year, your child's growth percentile, and a reporting category breakdown for ELA, Mathematics and Science, Technology, and Engineering. We will be hosting a parent information coffee about the MCAS and how to interpret your child's results in the upcoming weeks. In the meantime, should you have any questions about how to interpret your child's test results, please do not hesitate to contact us.
