A Message from Joe Kay

Last week, the High School concluded the first half of the school year with three days of Mid Year Exams. Below are a few reminders about our policies regarding viruses. Please follow these guidelines to help limit the transmission of illness.

- Students must stay home if they have a fever >100.4. They may return to school when fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication like Tylenol/ibuprofen.
