Today marks the 103 day of the 2019-2020 school year. Traditionally the mid-year point is when our school community takes time to reflect on the current school year and what lies ahead. This year our institutional reflection takes on a special meaning in light of the Student Opportunity Act.

This week it is Exhibitions of Mastery time once again, second quarter report cards have been sent home, and opportunities where students can demonstrate and celebrate the positive ramifications of hard work abound. We beam with pride as our students make great strides in academics, service, and life. For second quarter alone 188 students received an Honors commendation and 201 students received a First Honors commendation. To be recognized for Honors a student must earn a grade point average of 3.0 or above and have no more than one grade between 73 and 79. To

receive a First Honors commendation a student must earn a grade point average of 3.67 or above with no grade less than 80. On Levels III and IV 107 students earned Honors and 134 students earned First Honors. At the high school 81 students earned Honors and 67 students earned High Honors. Congratulations to all students who are being recognized for their hard work and accomplishment this week.

It has been an action-packed February here at SSCPS. Our classrooms and hallways continue to be places where students are happy, working hard, and showing kindness to one another. The Spelling Bees have been competitive and fun, the Mock Trial Team has ventured out and conquered, and we are looking forward to another exciting Fashion Walk on Friday. Last Thursday Level IV students on the newly established Math Team competed in the South Chapter MathCounts Competition in New Bedford. The results were impressive: out of 140 competitors, our students ranked 6 of the top 32. Two of our students earned wildcard status and the team is looking forward to further competition. Congratulations to all.

Mid-year is also the time of year when we ask for your input by completing the 2020 Annual Family Survey. Every year the Board of Trustees reviews key measures which help define student achievement and institutional strength. Parent voice is what has made our school a success and our school culture is built upon the engagement of all. The data gleaned from the survey will become an essential component in the planning soon to be underway for the Student Opportunity Act. The data you provide will be used to build the Accountability Plan and the Annual Report. This year's Annual Report will target measures to lift all students and reduce the state-wide achievement gap by incorporating your feedback on programming, scheduling, curriculum, professional development, facilities, and student life. We are asking for you to help by completing the survey by Friday, April 3, 2020.


All current families should have received an email that will look like the example below. The email will include a link to the annual Intent to Return forms.

For those of you new to SSCPS, families who would like to remain enrolled do not need to reapply. The Letter of Intent is the only form we ask our families to complete.

If your child has a sibling you would like to enroll or if you have a sibling on the waitlist you must complete an application to be included in the upcoming enrollment lottery. 


### From the Health Office
