It has been an eventful couple of weeks since our return from winter break both in our buildings and in the outside world. The deluge of information in the news about the coronavirus is both overwhelming and virtually unavoidable. This can be difficult for children. Our faculty and staff are acutely aware that children take their emotional cues from adults. Teachers are working hard to be calm and reassuring with our children. They are supporting their students as they process all that they are hearing and correcting the many misconceptions that are causing anxiety. We are following our protocols while moving ahead with the important work of teaching and learning and providing students with the routine and sense of normalcy that makes them feel safe.

One of those routines is the flurry of Exhibition of Mastery (EoM) presentations that surround February break. These presentations continue for students across grades. Whether students are sharing with their class what they learned from researching how a specific vegetable grows in first grade, or presenting a legal argument to their peers and a panel of lawyers in the high school Mock Trial Workshop, students are developing and honing the important research, writing, and presentation skills that they need for college and career success. These presentations are an essential component of our academic program and a rite of passage for students. As part of our implementation of this year's School Improvement Plan, we have begun to collect EoM materials and document practices by Level to help students and parents through the process. This project is the direct result of parent feedback as we were developing the plan. Last week the School Council began to work on drafting new goals and benchmarks for the 2020-2021 School Improvement Plan. School Council meetings are open meetings, please feel free to attend and provide your input as we develop this important plan. Our next meeting is on Thursday, April 2nd. If you are unable to attend and have suggestions, do not hesitate to reach out to me or to anyone who sits on School Council.

We are quickly moving into the time of the year when we start to look ahead to next year's programming in earnest. High school students and their teachers have begun the process of course selection for the 2020-2021 school year. Subject-specific teachers and student advisors are beginning the conversation with students about their course loads for the fall. Advanced Placement courses are available for students entering grades 10-12. Our tentative course offerings, the estimated homework load, and course prerequisites can be found here. The Advanced Placement information package can be found here. If your child is planning to take an Advanced Placement course next year I recommend that you carefully review the Advanced Placement materials with your child. I am happy to answer any questions you may have by email or phone.

Choosing Advanced Placement courses is the first step in the course selection process. Final course selections are made based on student interest, Advanced Placement contract submissions, and teacher recommendations. As the number of available courses grows, it becomes increasingly important for us to communicate with families about student schedules. The availability of courses varies by grade; choice increases as students move through the high school. The selections available in ninth grade are relatively narrow as students complete the foundational courses they need for high school success. Seniors have a wide number of courses available to them as they consider what they need to achieve their postsecondary goals. Significant consideration on the part of both teachers and students goes into these course selections. Once a working draft of course selections is available they will be sent home to parents and guardians for review. Both the guidance department and the curriculum coordinator team are available to answer questions and facilitate decisions.

Thank you for your support of our school as we navigate the current situation. Please continue to read school communications and to reach out with any questions or concerns.
