My name is Mary Carter and I am the Director of Guidance at SSCPS. I have worked in education for 22 years, 18 of which as a school counselor for here at SSCPS. It has been very exciting over the years to see the department grow from a single part time counselor to a full time counselor, to a department of 3 including a college counselor. Over the past two years we have built a college and career center, expanded college access through on the spot admission events, and seen our early applications to 4-year institutions increase to almost 50 percent!

The mission of the guidance department is to work with students to encourage them to achieve their unique potential, become a life-long learner and contributing member of society. This is done through individual and group counseling, classroom guidance, and utilizing our college guidance platform, Naviance.

### What to expect from your Guidance Department by grade Guidance by grade:

#### Freshman Year

The goal of freshman year guidance is to help students transition into high school.

- Freshman Convocation Monday Aug 26 (Orientation for Class of 2023)
- Assist students with time management, study skills, and report card review
- · Help students understand the importance of a strong freshman year
- All freshman will create a CollegeBoard and Naviance account

#### Sophomore Year

During the sophomore year, guidance supports students in their academics with a focus on test taking. As sophomores, students will take MCAS and a practice PSAT in the Spring.

- Work with students on career development
- Encourage students to keep up with community service
- Counsel students on Advanced Placement courses for Junior year
- Utilize Naviance for exploring college majors and careers

#### Junior Year

Junior year is a very important year for post-secondary planning.

- Course selection and college planning timeline
- SAT Day Exam April 2020 (all Juniors)
- Attend the National College Fair in Spring
- Utilize Naviance to search colleges and create initial college list

postsecondary plan.

- Senior Boot Camp (Aug 26-28) to help kick off Senior year
- Meet with seniors about college checklist with Exit Standards & Graduation Requirements
- Utilize Naviance for college application submission
- Assist with Financial Aid and Scholarship search
- Help students develop a post-secondary plan
