This November we have hosted numerous visitors. On November 15, we had a wonderful visit from State Senator Patrick O'Connor. Senator O'Connor spent the day traveling to our K-12 classrooms, meeting students and talking to teachers. At the high school, Senator O'Connor spoke to our 12th grade students about obligation and the need he felt to improve the community as well as the decisions that led to becoming a public servant. Our ninth grade students learned about the career paths that lead to the Commonwealth's legislative branch. In speaking to Ashley Hiehiapo's fifth grade history class, Senator O'Connor talked about how politics play a role in individual lives and the impact of some of the laws put into place by the state's Senate and House of Representatives. Senator O'Connor finished the day with a question and answer session fueled by some highly inquisitive fifth graders.

On Thursday morning, November 21, we hosted another interesting group of visitors; thirty members of <u>Leadership South Shore</u>. Leadership South Shore is a community building educational program founded by the South Shore Bank and the South Shore Chamber of Commerce. Participants of this year-long program are business leaders who are seeking to learn more about the opportunities and challenges throughout south shore communities. The focus of the Education Day was *Diversity and Inclusion in Education*. That morning a full bus load of participants came to our school specifically to learn about our successful educational models of inclusion and the diversity that makes our school so unique. Visitors were led on a campus tour of 100, 104, and 700 Longwater where they had the opportunity to observe instruction and speak to teachers. Later that afternoon, Achille Yangambi, Mathematics Curriculum Coordinator, traveled to Southeastern Regional Vocational Technical High School to participate in Leadership South Shore's panel *The Progress of Education on the South Shore*. We were honored to be part of this special day and enjoyed our guests tremendously.

November visits continued at Open House. The South Shore Charter Public School held the first Enrollment Open House on Saturday, November 16. Within two hours over 100 people came through our doors to learn more about our school. Prospective students and their families were led on classroom tours by our students where they met teachers and posed questions. Guests asked about the day-to-day life of an SSCPS student in addition to some of the institutional traits that separate us from a traditional district school.

Many questions posed during the information sessions were about student expectations as well as the teaching and learning we have instituted to ensure that every student meets the expectations of a college preparatory curriculum. There were great questions about art and music classes, as well as specific questions about our Honors and Advanced Placement options at the high school. Many families were very interested in knowing that our World Language program is K-12, with Spanish being offered as early as kindergarten.

Families are frequently surprised to discover that charter schools are public schools and follow the laws, guidelines, and curriculum frameworks defined by the Massachusetts Department of Education. Many of the questions families asked were about our inclusion model and the Learning Services program. After listening to so many families who have students in other districts, we remain thankful that we are able to offer an educational model that provides opportunities for every child.

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Providing opportunity for every student is at the core of what we do here at SSCPS every day. It is in the sprit of our mission statement; inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life that students and teachers at the high school have introduced the <u>Best Buddies</u> program. New to SSCPS this month, the Best Buddies program will pair students to support the friendships that will develop over time. Although the Best Buddies program traditionally pairs special needs student with regular education students, we intend on shifting that paradigm. Here at South Shore Charter, we recognize the need for all students to build friendships with one another; we will be offering special events for all students to get together and socialize in an informal way in a variety of settings.

The Best Buddies program at SSCPS is for all students interested in forming social relationships with others. Participating students can be paired in a one-to-one match for friendship; there are no requirements for participating other than the desire to make more friends and enhance a sense of <u>belonging to a community</u>. Students may opt to be an associate member who participates in any of the social events. We are excited to be starting this program here at school and are thrilled that our students are fully committed to making a great program work so well for all.
