#### A Message from Alicia ...

The first week of December is upon us and I would like to thank our families and school community for all of the efforts which have sustained us thus far. I hope all of our families spent last week enjoying the Thanksgiving holiday and the extra time spent with immediate family members. It seems that each day brings with it a new series of challenges and questions, and our school community has been supporting one another through it all.

There is so much good news to share. Just last week we learned that our school has won the first *Invent the Summer* - *School of the Summer* award. *Invent the Summer* is a non-profit organization established by students for students whose mission it is to "...inspire creativity, resourcefulness, innovation, problem solving, and leadership." Students from grades 1-7 took on the research and design of engineering solutions to problems they were presented with or identified themselves.

Using the critical thinking and learning skills inherent to our Project and Workshop model, eight of our students worked throughout the summer making weekly video contributions to the *Invent the Summer* program. These eight students contributed 32 entries to the summer challenges. Because of their perseverance and brilliance, our school has won the first place prize of \$250.00. Sixth grade student, Siddharth Monagari won an individual prize *Overall Inventor of the Summer*. We could not be more proud. Congratulations to all participants.

# Holiday Travel Advisory

With the Thanksgiving holiday in the rear view mirror, and the remaining holiday season approaching, we would like to remind families of the health and safety guidelines put forward by Governor Baker and the Massachusetts Department of Public Health in the recently updated COVID-19 Travel Order. The South Shore Charter Public School has enacted a strict travel protocol which requires that all students who return from traveling to high risk states or countries, or students who have been on a plane, must quarantine for fourteen (14) days. Students in grades 2-12 are expected to learn remotely during the 14-day quarantine period. Students in grades K-1 are expected to utilize their

learning bins.

Our school policy regarding voluntary travel is stricter than the Massachusetts Travel Order. There is no exemption from quarantine if your child tests negative **prior** to returning to Massachusetts. Because of the nature of COVID-19 transmission, and the chance of exposure within the 72-hour period prior to returning to Massachusetts, the school does not consider the described testing measure to be adequately preventative. A 14-day quarantine is required by our school's <u>Health Office</u>.

# IMPORTANT Weekly COVID-19 Health Report Released on Thursday

The <u>Massachusetts Department of Public Health Weekly COVID-19 Report</u>, including the city/town data and map, will be posted on Thursday evening. The next report is scheduled for tomorrow, December 3, 2020.

The weekly report provides the count and rate of confirmed COVID-19 cases and tests, including the daily incidence rate in Massachusetts cities and towns over the last two weeks. We use this data as one way to determine if our school needs to transition learning models. If over 25 percent of our student population municipalities turn red for **three consecutive weeks**, the school will transition to or sustain full remote learning.

Our sending district student populations are as follows:

Weymouth 26% Randolph 21% Brockton 11% Rockland 9% Hanover 3%

These calculations mean the following:

Weymouth red = Full Remote Learning

Randolph + Rockland red = Full Remote Learning

Brockton + Randolph red = Full Remote Learning

District student percentage must add up to 25% or more to activate the transition to full remote learning. Last week one of our sending districts

remained red as determined by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

The school has transitioned back to hybrid and in-person learning. We will be sending email notification to all families on Friday with updates regarding the current COVID-19 district metrics. Please be sure your contact information has been updated with the school by completing your emergency contact information.

#### COVID-19 Check

Please remember to check your child for COVID-19 symptoms including temperature before arriving at school or getting on the bus. Wellness checks should be completed on School Pass. If your child is absent with symptoms or has been tested, even if negative you must **notify the health office** before your child returns to school. Please use the **attendance email** that is found on the SSCPS website to report a student absence even if your child is not ill but will be working remotely that day. If it is not reported you will receive a phone call from the school regarding the your child's absence.

- will work with other members of the BOT and the school to foster stronger ties with parents, businesses, non-profit foundations, and sending communities







HALF DAY/CRAFT DAY!!!!
For Levels I and Level II

We are going to attempt to run a pandemic friendly half day/craft day this year and keep the tradition alive!! As most know, the kids really love this day each year and I'm happy we have figured out a way to do something on a smaller scale to keep this going in 2020.

#### The plan....

Half Day/Craft Day will be Wednesday, Dec 23 – the day before school break for the holidays. It is a remote day of ALL students.

Levels I & II (including K)

2 parents (minimum) donate individually packaged crafts for the total number of children in class to be delivered to school by Thursday, December 10, so teachers have 2 weeks to hand out crafts

On 12/23 – children in same pod will log on and complete same crafts together virtually

#### The ask....

- \* We need AT LEAST two volunteers from each class to prepare individually wrapped crafts for the children to make for about 22 kids and deliver to school BY THURSDAY DECEMBER 10.
- \* If you're willing to volunteer please email your level rep with your name and THE CLASS YOUR CHILD IS IN. This way we make sure we have at least two crafts per class.
- \* Any questions, please direct to Your Level Rep and not the teachers— we do not want to give them any extra work.
- \* NO FOOD ITEMS and NO GLITTER (you're welcome)
- \* You can assume each child has crayons, scissors and glue sticks at home as they were provided in their bins by the school, but anything else would need to be provided. Nothing that requires a glue gun please.
- \* If you're willing, it would be great if you could make an appearance on craft day (virtually) to your child's class to explain the craft
- \* We are figuring out a contactless pick up for remote only students- we want
