## A Message from Alicia



The Arts at SSCPS send virtual and physical greetings with a field of pinwheels fashioned by K-8 students.

We are now one full week into learning at the South Shore Charter Public School. Whether your child is in-person, hybrid, or full remote, there is one thing that is certain; this year looks different. When in-person, students are working hard to adjust to the distancing and hygiene protocols that are necessary. When learning remotely, students are adjusting to Google Classroom, Google Meet, and logging in and staying connected to their teacher and classmates.

Little of this is the way it should be. Our new learning landscape feels far from normal. Yet our children and teachers are working hard to make a difficult situation work. Your support and kind words have been taken to heart and are much

appreciated. Although our learning curve is great, we continue to move forward the best way we know how. I know for myself, I am grateful for each student that logs in or walks through our door. In spite of everything, there's something about September that exudes hope.

One of the scenarios we have been asked to plan for is a transition to full remote learning. The state has given us some guidelines regarding COVID-19 test positivity rates in our sending districts. Every Wednesday afternoon, the state releases a <a href="Weekly COVID-19 Public Health Report">Weekly COVID-19 Public Health Report</a>. This weekly report provides the count and rate of confirmed COVID-19 cases and tests, including the daily incidence rate in Massachusetts cities and towns over the last two weeks. We will use this data as one way to determine if our school needs to transition to full remote learning.

Key Municipalities: If over 25 percent of our student population municipalities turn red, the school will transition to full remote learning on the Thursday following the Wednesday announcement. The school will transition back to hybrid and inperson learning once the COVID-19 testing positivity rate goes down and the sending district(s) is/are in the yellow, green, or grey the Monday following the release of the calculations.

Our sending district student populations are as follows:

Weymouth 26% Randolph 20% Brockton 11% Rockland 10% Hanover 3%

This means that if Weymouth were to turn red, we would transition to full remote learning. If other districts totalling 25% or more went red, we would transition to full remote learning. Possible combinations could be Randolph and Rockland, Brockton and Randolph, or any combination of sending districts that add up to 25% or more of our student population. Any one of those districts, Randolph, Brockton, Rockland, Hanover, or others, if alone in turning red, would not cause our school to transition to full remote learning. The districts have to add up to 25% or more to activate the transition.

Once the sending district(s) are no longer red, the school will transition back to hybrid and in-person learning. Transitioning from red occurs once the COVID-19 testing positivity rate goes down and the sending district is in the yellow, green, or grey. When this happens, our school will resume hybrid instruction on the Monday following the release of the most recent calculations.

Should we need to make the transition to full remote learning, we will notify families through our telephone and email emergency notification system. Please be sure your contact information is updated with the correct phone numbers and email addresses. As always, please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions you may have.
