A Message from Angie

Our K-4 students have just completed their first trimester and our 5-12 students find themselves in the middle of the second quarter. This is an excellent time for teachers to connect with families and assess student progress in this first part of the school year. Families of students in grades 1-4 can expect first trimester report cards to come home with their children today. Please look for the report card in your child's backpack. Teachers of students in grades 5-12 will post

progress reports in <u>PlusPortals</u> by this afternoon. For each core academic subject families can expect to find a progress report that includes an updated course average along with category subtotals and scores for individual assignments and assessments. Families will have the opportunity to discuss student progress with teachers directly during our parent teacher conferences which begin on Friday. We have sent notification regarding the registration process by email. Please reach out if you have not received an email and would like to schedule a conference. We are scheduling additional conference opportunities for grades 5-8 to accommodate the high demand.



As we reflect on student progress in Math, English Language Arts, Science, History, and World Language, I'd also like us to celebrate student work in the fine arts and performing arts. For many of our students art and music classes, along with the Projects, Workshops, and extracurricular activities that go along with them, are the most motivating and rewarding parts of their school day. Last year many of these opportunities were significantly reduced or lost due to the health crisis. We are lucky to have a dedicated arts faculty working to bring as great a sense of normalcy as is possible to these subjects this school year. Thanks to their hard work, the arts are thriving at SSCPS.

This fall saw the return of our before school Concert Band program for students in grades 5-12. The department also expanded band offerings during the school day with the introduction of a band Project on both Level III and on Level IV in addition to the choral Project teachers have run in previous years. The department has expanded after school offerings with the addition of an afterschool strings program for students in grades 5-8. We are looking forward to the continued expansion of this program and the addition of others in the years to come.



The music department will highlight student work in a virtual concert this month that includes submissions from our K-4 students, the concert band, the beginning middle school instrument groups, the Level III and Level IV choral groups, and the high school Music Workshop. Students are recording their individual performances at home and our music department will compile those performances to share with the community. Submissions must be uploaded by this Friday in order to be included in the concert. Thank you for your support at home with these submissions. We are very much hoping that we will be able to hold a more traditional concert in the spring.

FY22 School Calendar Modifications

On Thursday, November 1, the SSCPS Board of Trustees voted to modify the FY22 School Calendar due to instructional days missed. Changes are as follows:

- January 14, 2022 is a Professional Development Day. Due to the need for 180 days in the school year, that day will now be the following:
 - Grades K-6 Full Day of Classes
 - Grades 7-12 Level and Department Meetings

Unless there is a snow day(s), this leaves one day to make up for students in grades 1 and 2 which is now a half day on June 21, 2022.

There will be no school on June 20, the state holiday Juneteenth.

ATTN PARENTS: COVID Test Information for Students

In order for your student to receive a COVID BinaxNOW test at school, or to participate in the Test and Stay program, **they MUST be pre-registered.** Please take a moment and sign up now. This allows your student to be able to stay in school if the test is negative.

If students are not signed up and are a close contact or develop symptoms at school, they will be required to be picked up immediately. Register with your students' information with the following link:

If you are setting up a secondary account, Please put the code: **KDHEHV** under the organization code.

COVID vaccine: If your student has or is getting the COVID vaccine, please send in a copy of the vaccine card or proof after receiving the second vaccine. You only need to send a copy after the second dose is given.

With the rise in COVID cases we are asking that you make sure your student comes to school each day with a proper fitting mask that covers both the mouth and nose. Proper fitting masks are crucial in reducing the risk of in school transmission of COVID. They should also have a back up mask in their backpacks in case their mask becomes dirty or ruined throughout the day.

From the Health Office:

NEW - Meningococcal Requirements

7th GRADERS:

All 7th grade students need a current physical on file. They are required to have the first does of the Meningococcal Vaccine and the Tdap vaccine.

11th GRADERS:

Please send in your 11th graders updated physical as soon as possible. There is a new requirement for the Meningococcal vaccine.

SPECIFICS:

2 doses; second dose MenACWY (formerly MCV4) must be given on or after the 16th birthday and ≥ 8 weeks after the previous dose. 1 dose is acceptable if it was given on or after the 16th birthday.

Update from the Health Office Regarding Weekly Testing

COVID-19 cases are rising within the state and within our school community. If your student is sick please have them remain home. If they are experiencing COVID symptoms they will need a negative PCR test or Molecular NAAT test to return to school. Please contact the health office if your student is home from school due to illness. COVID symptoms are very similar to common cold symptoms and it is important to rule out COVID before your student returns to school. Please keep your student home if there is a positive household member and contact the health office about the next steps.

Your student must stay home if you are waiting for COVID test results, whether they are symptomatic or asymptomatic. Please send a copy of the test results to the appropriate health office.

With the increase of COVID cases throughout Massachusetts, we are going to be starting Weekly Safety COVID testing at school. The tentative start date for this testing is January 4th and the plan is to test weekly on Tuesdays. This is a shallow nasal swab that most students will be able to do by themselves. About 10 swabs are put in the same pool test and a PCR test is run. This takes about 24 hours. You will only be notified if your student is in a positive pool test. If this happens, all individuals will be tested separately using the Rapid BinaxNOW test at school to try to identify the positive individual. If your student is negative, then they can return to class and learn. If your child is positive, then we will ask you to come pick them up and quarantine. Please sign up for COVID testing below.

The 2022 yearbook is coming - now is your chance to order yours! The normal yearbook price is \$40, but if you order before January 1st, you can get yours for \$37!


