

BLACK HISTORY MONTH AT SSCPS





A Message from Angie Pepin

While the weather has proven challenging over the past couple of weeks, students and teachers continue to push ahead with teaching and learning as we move past the midpoint of our school year. February is a month for celebration. This week students in the lower grades will be celebrating the highly-anticipated 100th day of school with a variety of hundred-themed activities. Throughout our classrooms across our buildings students are engaged with lessons and activities that celebrate Black History Month. Our teachers and students are finding creative ways to make bleak days outside joyful ones in our buildings.

Melissa's kindergarten class is celebrating February and our school with the "Why I Love Our School" Project. Kindergarten students are collecting hearts from students across our campus this month.

March is on the horizon and with it comes the start of the spring testing season.

This month the <u>Department of Elementary and Secondary Education</u> released its school report cards for Massachusetts public schools and districts. The report card provides information from the state accountability system, bringing together a set of measures around school performance. Our accountability results are calculated using data from several sources including MCAS, student attendance, high school completion, and enrollment in advanced coursework at the high school level. The COVID-19 crisis has impacted this year's report card data. In April 2021, as a result of the cancellation of the spring 2020 <u>MCAS</u> testing, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education requested and received a waiver of certain federal accountability requirements for the 2020-2021 school year from the US Department of Education. As a result, the DESE did not change school accountability determinations for last year. Our overall accountability classification, substantial progress toward targets, remains unchanged. Please take some time to review the report card and do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions about our data.

Last spring we saw a modified MCAS administration for students in grades 3-10. This year the state is returning to a typical MCAS administration. Students will test for two days for each tested subject. All MCAS exams will be computerbased Next-Generation MCAS tests. Please find this spring's MCAS schedule below.

While the 3-8 MCAS provides data about student learning and is a factor in our school's accountability status, it is the high school MCAS that has an impact on the individual student. All students are required by the state to meet the <u>Competency Determination</u> (CD) standard in order to earn a diploma. This means that students must earn a passing score on the ELA, Math, and Science MCAS exams. Last spring in response to the COVID-related school disruptions, the DESE modified the CD requirement for the class of 2021, allowing students to earn their CD through completed coursework. This Board of Education

extended this accommodation to the class of 2022. At this time students in the class of 2023 are required to pass MCAS exams to meet their CD requirement in both ELA and Math. The Competency Determination will return to pre-COVID requirements beginning with the class of 2024.

In other testing news, we will be administering an SAT exam to all Juniors on Wednesday, April 13th. Taking the exam in school provides students with the opportunity to take this important test in a comfortable environment with staff members they are familiar with. We will use this day to administer the PSAT 10 to the sophomore class and the PSAT 8/9 to students in grades 8 and 9. These exams provide teachers with important data as we plan interventions for students and adjust our curriculum. We will send out reminders as the date of these exams draws nearer.

At-Home Rapid Antigen Testing (NEW opt-in form)

Overview: At-Home Rapid Testing Program

- About the Test: <u>iHealth</u> is a 15-minute at-home FDA-approved rapid antigen test
- **Opt-In:** To participate, you must opt in by completing the form. By opting in, you will agree to review the training materials for test administration, report positive test results to your student's school, and administer the tests according to SSCPS Health Office guidelines.
- Weekly: Every two weeks you will receive an iHealth at-home rapid test kit. Each kit contains two individual tests. Your student will administer one test each week on Sunday.
- **Reporting Positive Test Results:** If your student tests positive on an at-home antigen test, you will inform their school of the positive result using the [Positive Test Result Notification form]. The school will keep the results confidential and will not make individual results public. In addition, it is strongly recommended that you inform your healthcare professional of the positive result.
- **Easy, Free, and Flexible**: This test is administered at home (not at school), reducing the burden on school staff and time to administer tests and increasing a family's flexibility to do testing in the home for free.

How do I submit results?

- Submit Results: You must submit positive test results to your student's school. <u>Click here</u> to submit positive test results.
- **Confidentiality**: Positive test results are shared with your school district for informational purposes only. Individual results will remain confidential, and they will never be made public.

The clinic is open for all Plymouth County residents on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays from 9am-3pm. Appointments can be made by logging onto <u>www.marshfieldcares.com</u> or the service is also available for walk-ins. The clinic has all 3 vaccines and boosters, if you have your vaccination card, please bring it with you. The vaccinations and test are done through a drive-thru operation that is free and convenient.


