Transportation

We know many of our families await news regarding transportation for the upcoming school year. We have been working with our new transportation provider, First Student, over the past six weeks to establish bus routes and finalize logistics based upon the surveys sent to families in July. Thank you to all families who responded to the survey. On Thursday we met with First Student and reviewed the final details of the 15 bus routes which will begin operation on the first day of school. The bus routes and stops are being finalized and we will be publishing transportation information as it becomes available. Transportation provided by the school is for students who reside in one of our 26 sending districts.

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John Toland, Interim K-4 Assistant Principal

John Toland will once again be serving as the Interim Assistant Principal for Grades K-4. John has served as a teacher on Level II for seven years. Jean-Paul Marcellus, Assistant Principal 5-8

Our new Assistant Principal for grades 5-8 will be Jean-Paul (JP) Marcellus. Since coming to SSCPS in 2019, JP has grown the athletics program to new heights. His work building relationships with students by fostering a sense of well being and accomplishment extends to our student athletes as well as every student in his PE class.



JP's experience supporting students and building athletic programs is extensive. Prior to SSCPS, JP built the athletics program at Dayspring Christian Academy where he served as the athletic director, the physical education and health teacher, and the boy's basketball head coach. JP has also held similar roles at Lexington Christian Academy where he began teaching following a successful collegiate and professional basketball career. Bringing his unique experience as a professional athlete, JP teaches the importance of setting goals and demonstrates the value of working hard. Christophe Teulet-Cote, Assistant Principal, 9-12

Christophe Teulet-Cote, known by his

students as TC, comes to SSCPS from the Boston Public Schools where he served as Assistant Headmaster for seventeen years at The English High School and Charlestown High School. Recently TC added Head of Middle School at Charlestown High to his school leadership experience when the school transitioned to a middle/high school model last year. TC also served on the SSCPS Board of Trustees in 2012.

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Prior to becoming Assistant Headmaster, TC was a lead teacher of AP United States History and World History at English High School. TC is certified in Restorative Justice and is trained and experienced in block scheduling and coordinating standardized exams. His focus on social and emotional learning, as well as his rapport with students both in and out of the classroom, provides students with the support they need to reach their highest potential.

TC's commitment to service and to the importance of teaching the whole child is in full alignment with our school's mission. Before coming to Boston, TC taught at the Wendell Phillips Academy High School in Chicago. He has been an exam writer and a course outline writer for the Chicago Public Schools and his extra-curricular experience includes founding student clubs and coaching athletics as well as service learning programs and school history fairs. TC has received the *Community Beautification Grant*, the *Illinois Department of Commerce and Communication Grant*, the *Oppenheimer Award*, the *Teacher Excellence Award*, the *American Red Cross Grant*, the *Close-Up Grant*, the *Youth Empowerment Grant*, and the *Youth As Resources Grant* in recognition of his professional accomplishment and dedication to service learning. TC served in the United States Marine Corps, holds a BA from the University of Illinois, a Master's in Educational Administration from University of Massachusetts, Boston, and is currently seeking his ED from Northeastern University.
