

It's even hard to believe that Monday was the last day of the third quarter for students in grades 5-11. Although we have completed a significant portion of the school year, there is much to accomplish and look forward to in the weeks ahead.


Today provides the perfect example. The high school students from the Art Workshop have been working all year on sustainable fashion that they have designed and created. The Fashion Show, a yearly tradition, will be held later this month. However, earlier today there was an exciting Fashion Walk Preview at 100 Longwater Circle. Students in the lower grades were treated to a terrific show as the high school students honed their Exhibitions of Mastery skills and demonstrated what talent and perseverance create. A win-win morning for all.





I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all the families who participated in the Annual Family Satisfaction Survey. Every year survey results are used to inform the decision making process, particularly when funding opportunities arise. This year we received 285 responses from 656 families bringing our response rate up to 43%. Your input helps us guide necessary decisions inherent to institutional growth. We all share the same goals; enhancing classroom resources, supporting project-based learning, making sure students have opportunities to study music and art. We also share a commitment to community service, extracurricular activities, and our growing athletic program. The preliminary results of the survey have been tabulated and the results may be found <u>here</u>.

The survey data will be reviewed by the Board of Trustees at the May meeting on Thursday, May 11, 2023 and at the summer July meeting when we review the Annual Report and plan for the year ahead. All responses in the Comments sections will be reviewed at that time. In March, the Board of Trustees reviewed data taken from Question 4, "SSCPS offers a rigorous academic program that prepares students well for future schooling." this year as well as over a three-year trajectory. This year 95.42% of families K-12 indicated *Agreed* or *Strongly Agreed* that the English Language Arts curriculum is rigorous, and 94.64% *Agreed* or *Strongly Agreed* that the Mathematics curriculum is rigorous. Similarly, 96.14% of families *Agreed* or *Strongly Agreed* that the Social Studies/History curriculum is rigorous, 93.08% *Agreed* or *Strongly Agreed* that students are offered a rigorous curriculum for World Languages, and 87.16% *Agreed* or *Strongly Agreed* that students are offered a rigorous Arts curriculum.



This year we added a sliding scale rating question and a comments section seeking feedback about our new regional transportation program. We are happy to report that 30.88% of families gave the new transportation program a rating of *10 Outstanding*, the highest rating possible. The rating was the most frequently chosen and the weighted average rating for the new transportation program is 9.38. We will be reviewing all comments and suggestions as we plan for next year's transportation services.

Although our academic programming remains consistently strong, feedback regarding our school facilities has consistently highlighted the need for campus improvements. Ideally we would like to add learning commons at the high school for library sciences, a science and a computer lab, additional studios for art classes, a gym which could double as a performance area, and an athletic field. Next year we will begin planning for the new five-year strategic plan and we will include all survey data since the 2020 Strategic Plan.

Thank you for supporting our mission of inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life.

FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

With spring upon us the health office wanted to send out some reminders.

- Caffeinated beverages are not allowed in the K through 8 building. This includes coffee, energy drinks and soda.
- Please make sure to check your students for ticks daily, although students are not allowed in the woods, ticks can travel.
- Sunscreen and bug spray can not be applied at school. Please apply bug spray or sunscreen before sending your student to school in the morning.
- Please send your students to school daily with a reusable water bottle.
- Level I students should have a complete change of clothes in their backpacks.

Please keep your students home if they have any off the following symptoms/illness

- Fever greater than 100.0
- Vomiting/diarrhea in last 24 hours
- Not able to manage cough/nasal congestion
- Test positive for COVID

When can my student return to school

- Fever free for 24 hours without medication (if you give Tylenol or Motrin in the morning, please keep student home from school)
- No vomiting/diarrhea for 24 hours
- Well enough to stay at school for the day





MASSHEALTH REDETERMINATIONS



Starting April 1, 2023, MassHealth will begin the eligibility redetermination process, renewing all 2.3M members over the following 12 months. This will generally be the first-time members are at risk of losing their coverage since February 2020. In preparation for this effort, MassHealth has increased staffing significantly to handle a greater volume of calls and applications, improved our systems to automatically renew as many members' coverage as possible, and is working in close collaboration with health plans, providers, and other stakeholders. Even with this preparation, we understand that this may be difficult for members.
