

#### A Message from Haley

At South Shore Charter, the month of March marks a busy time of year for our world language program. We recently celebrated National Foreign Language Week and the Seal

of Biliteracy testing is in full swing.

We celebrated National Foreign Language week earlier this month from March 5th-11th. Promoting the value of language learning is increasingly crucial in our globalized and interconnected society. National Foreign Language Week serves to highlight and honor all languages. This year's poster showcases the cognitive benefits associated with learning languages. People who learn languages improve their memory, as well as their ability to focus, multitask, and resolve problems.

At SSCPS, nearly half of our student population has a multilingual background. In fact, there are 39 different languages spoken among our students, in addition to English. Throughout National Foreign Language Week, students learned about the benefits of knowing multiple languages and participated in lessons that examined the similarities and differences between English and other languages. In the high school, students shared fun facts about languages over the PA system and students participated in daily trivia with a chance to win prizes. Music from various backgrounds filled the halls and students danced between classes. The students were enthusiastic about demonstrating their language skills and were eager to learn about languages they were not as familiar with. Observing the

students' interest and respect towards languages and cultures other than their own was truly heartwarming.

#### **Seal of Biliteracy**



"One language sets you in a corridor for life; two languages opens every door along the way"

We are just wrapping up testing with our senior class, and I am excited for the opportunity to honor several of our students with the Massachusetts Seal of Biliteracy at graduation this June. These students have worked extremely hard, preparing for years, testing for days and ultimately demonstrating high level language skills in both English and a second language. In April, we will begin administering tests to our qualifying sophomore and juniors.

#### What is the State Seal of Biliteracy?

The MA State Seal of Biliteracy is an award provided by our school in recognition of students who have attained proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in two or more languages by the time they reach high school graduation. The MA Seal of Biliteracy, adopted from the state, takes the form of a seal that appears on the transcript and diploma of the graduating senior. This recognition may be presented to colleges and future employers.

#### The Purpose of the State Seal

The purpose of the MA State Seal is to:

- Encourage students to study and master languages
- Certify attainment of biliteracy skills

- Recognize the value of language diversity
- Provide employers with a method of identifying people with language and biliteracy skills
- Provide universities with a method to recognize and give credit to applicants for the attainment of high-level skills in languages
- Prepare students with skills that will benefit them in the labor market and the global society
- Strengthen intergroup communication and honor the multiple cultures and languages in a community

#### **Criteria for Obtaining the State Seal**

In order to earn the Massachusetts State Seal of Biliteracy, students must:

- 1. Demonstrate a high level of proficiency in English by earning a score of 472 or higher on the Grade 10 ELA MCAS test.
- 2. Demonstrate a high level of proficiency in a world language by attaining a minimum score equivalent to Intermediate-High on a state-approved assessment
- 3. Satisfy all other graduation requirements.

We believe that all students are capable of learning a new language and are committed to expanding the SSCPS world language program to provide opportunities for students to develop both their language skills and cultural awareness.



#### NEW SSCPS/CMI ROWING PROGRAM!

The South Shore Charter Public School is partnering with Cohasset Maritime Institute. We are working to be able to offer students in grades 7-9 a new after school rowing program.

#### FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

With the winter season upon us we wanted to send out some reminders from the Health office. We are seeing an increase in viral illness in our school community and would like to remind everyone of the policy about staying home when ill.

Please keep students home from school for the following:

- Fever greater than 100.0
- Vomiting/diarrhea in last 24 hours
- Not able to manage cough/nasal congestion
- Test positive for COVID

When can my student return to school

- Fever free for 24 hours without medication (if you give tylenol or motrin in the morning, please keep student home from school)
- No vomiting/diarrhea for 24 hours
- Well enough to stay at school for the day

If your student becomes ill at school, please pick your student up within 45 minutes. If it important to pick up your student

Home COVID tests were sent home with every student prior to Thanksgiving break. Please do an at home COVID test if your student has cold like symptoms (sore throat, headache, cough, runny nose, or fever)

The school does not provide masks. If you would like your student to wear a mask at school, please send them to school with one on and extras

Kids are going out in all weather, please make sure your student has appropriate winter clothing. It is also important to have a change of clothes at school for days they get wet or need to change clothes for other reasons.

All students should be bringing a water bottle to school every day and can refill at the water refill station.
