Hispanic Heritage Month


Here at SSCPS, we are proud to recognize and celebrate Hispanic Heritage month from September 15 to October 15 each year. This observance is a time to celebrate the achievements, histories, traditions and cultural diversity of Hispanic/Latino/Latinx Americans whose heritage is rooted in 20 Latin American countries and territories: Spain,

Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, Paraguay, Chile, Argentina, Uruguay, Cuba, Puerto Rico, and the Dominican Republic. This year's Hispanic Heritage Month theme is Unidos: Inclusivity for a stronger nation. Hispanic Heritage month is an opportunity to honor the rich Hispanic culture in our communities. It is also a time to remind students and children of all ages the value of diversity.

On Levels I & II, students have explored a variety of famous Hispanic Americans and their contributions to the arts, sciences, music, sports, and more. They have read poems and children's books that highlight notable people of Hispanic descent, such as Frida Kahlo, Pablo Neruda, Sandra Cisneros and Rita Morena. As they learned about their origins, students were excited to talk about their own families, the countries they are from, and their heritage. Levels I & II Spanish teacher Marion Whalen Finn noted, "It was such a delight to go into the classroom and have students eager to tell me all they are learning about with Hispanic Heritage month from their primary teacher." In Spanish lessons, there was a focus on student voice and how you can say something in many different ways. This transitioned to talking about Hispanic people who use or used their voice to change the world.

On Level III, students dove into the history of Hispanic Heritage month and how it is observed across the country. Students chose a famous Hispanic American and presented background information as well as the ways they positively influenced and enriched our nation. As part of this project, students created bottle people that were representative of these Hispanic Americans. Teachers used authentic materials written by authors and poets such as Mario Vargas Llosa and Sandra Cisernos to teach interpretive reading skills to their classes. Gallery walks allowed students to expand their knowledge of many more influential Hispanic figures. On Level IV, students dug deep into the history and rich cultures of Hispanic countries and created group projects. These presentations shared pertinent information about each country and included hand-illustrated maps.

Students Researching Influential Hispanic Writers



In our high school, Hispanic Heritage decor and music filled the halls. Students researched and presented on famous artists, athletes, politicians, writers, scientists and other influential figures. In Spanish classes, students participated in gallery walks and analyzed a variety of poems by Pablo Neruda and Julia Alvarez and artwork by Pablo Picasso and Frida Kahlo. Others researched labor leaders and civil rights activists Cesar Chavez and Dolores Huerta alongside Nobel Peace Prize laureate Rigoberto Menchú. The Cultural Diversity Workshop wrote poems highlighting famous Hispanic Americans' contributions to society and created crafts to display on the walls. On Fridays, students were exposed to different genres of Latin music and dance such as Salsa, Merengue, Bachata, Samba and Tango. During breaks, students had fun following along with video tutorials and picking up a few new steps.

Hispanic Heritage Month is an important opportunity for students to not only learn about history and culture, but also to celebrate diversity in the classroom and our school community.

From the Health Office

All 4th, 7th and 11th graders should have a current physical (within the last 12 months) on file in the appropriate health office. All students playing sports must have a current physical in order to play.

With the colder weather coming there has been an increase in illnesses at school. Please keep your child home if they are not feeling well. Students must stay home if they have a fever, vomiting/diarrhea, uncontrollable cough or runny nose or just not feeling well enough to stay at school for a full day.

Make sure you have emergency contacts listed (other than a parent). If your child needs to go home sick, please make sure to have a plan to have yourself or someone else pick them up within 30 minutes.

As a reminder, the students go outside in all kinds of weather unless below 20 degrees or heavy rain. It is important to have a change of clothes at school and come dressed in appropriate clothing for all weather.
