

#### Computer Science Education Week and the "Hour of Code®"

This week is Computer Science Education Week, an annual initiative aimed at inspiring K-12 students to engage with computer science, advocating for equity in education, and celebrating the valuable contributions of students, teachers, and partners to the field of computer science.

Computer Science Education Week is an annual event designed to promote and celebrate computer science education. Held in early December, it features various activities, workshops, and events globally to engage students, educators, and communities in learning about computer science. The week aims to highlight the importance of computational thinking, coding skills, and technological literacy in today's world, encouraging participation and interest in computer science among people of all ages and backgrounds.

During Computer Science Education Week, observed from December 4–10, 2023, schools worldwide will participate in the 'Hour of Code ®'. This initiative emphasizes that within a single hour, people can grasp the basics of coding. However, the Hour of Code aims for more than just teaching coding skills in an hour; it aims to expand access to computer science, challenge stereotypes, and create opportunities.



While some participants may understand fundamental programming concepts such as loops and conditionals, the primary aim is for ALL (students and educators, even caregivers) to discover the excitement of computer science—it's inclusive, timeless, and can start in any classroom or home, even without a computer. It is not just about computer science and endeavors to forge cross-curricular connections and relevancy as a universal discipline. Digital literacy and computer science play crucial roles in K-12 education for several reasons:



**Preparation for the Future:** In a digital age, equipping students with digital literacy skills early on prepares them for the future workforce, where technology proficiency is increasingly essential across various fields.

#### Problem-Solving and Critical Thinking:

Computer science education fosters problem-solving skills and critical thinking by encouraging students to analyze complex problems, break them down into smaller parts, and develop logical solutions.

**Creativity and Innovation:** It nurtures creativity and innovation by allowing students to create projects, programs, and digital content, fostering their abilities to express ideas in unique ways.

**Career Opportunities:** Exposure to computer science at a young age can spark interest in technology-related careers, offering students a pathway into high-demand fields like software development, data science, cybersecurity, and more.

#### Adaptability and Digital Citizenship:

Digital literacy instills adaptability to evolving technology and helps students become responsible digital citizens, teaching them about online safety, privacy, and ethical use of technology.

Integration Across Subjects: Computer science can be integrated across various subjects, enhancing learning experiences in math, science, arts, and other disciplines.



Overall, digital literacy and computer science education in K-12 provide foundational skills, prepare students for the future, and empower them to navigate an increasingly technology-driven world. With all of this will come some great happenings here at SSCPS that


centralize around digital literacy and computer science. We have been awarded the CS Engage Grant, which will entail a 3 year initial investment for roll out, in which SSCPS will work with the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and CSForAll (Computer Science For All Students) to develop K-12 Digital Literacy Computer Science standards and curriculum for implementation. This will provide opportunities for all of the students in which we can improve on current courses offered, as well as work to provide more Computer Science opportunities at all grade levels; whether it be through FIT, embedded class instruction, project or workshop, and during after school enrichment programs. We look forward to this partnership and collaboration and the benefits it will bring to our school community and academic programming.

#### **LOST & FOUND**

**LABEL** everything that comes to school. We check all clothing for names before donating and 95% of the time there is no name.

**TEACH** your child/ren that while it is great to donate their used coats, they may want to hold onto it for at least one season.

**FOLLOW** the FB sites to see pics of lost items.

**UNDERSTAND** the program is run by volunteers and dates are subject to change.

#### From the Health Office

Students entering K, 4th, 7th and 12th grade are required to submit a current physical form that is less than 13 months old. All students planning on participating in sports must have a current physical submitted to the health office and uploaded to the SchoolID website when registering the student to participate in sports. Students who do not have a current physical form on file will not be allowed to try out or participate in any sports programs.

If your student is sick we ask that you keep them home from school. Absences with a

doctor's note will be excused absences. Your student is required to stay home in the following situations:

- **Fever**. Students may return to school once fever has resolved for 24 hours without any medications.
- Vomiting or diarrhea. Students may return to school once vomiting or diarrhea has resolved for 24 hours.
- Contagious illnesses (such as strep or conjunctivitis). Students may return after starting antibiotics for 24 hours and remain fever free for 24 hours.
- Positive for COVID-19. Please contact your school nurse to determine when your student can

Students who develop any of these symptoms during the school day will need to be picked up promptly.
