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
A Message from Alicia

It is no wonder our students were inclined to highlight the significance of this poem. First read while they were on Levels I and II, there is a new perspective to the poem that comes with time. Growing from childhood to adolescence, teenagers understand the power of aspirations. Who better understands the importance of *holding fast* to that which lives within you? Who more fully understands the pressures of overbearing conformity? Who more competently understands the pain of negative messages that left unchecked pull away hope and achievement? And who more effectively realizes that the path towards a more equitable and just society comes to life first within growing outward with time. Our students have looked through the lens of Langston Hughes' poetry and found recognition of their own resilience, creativity, and enduring spirit.



Here at South Shore Charter, Black History Month is about that enduring spirit. We celebrate with multiple learning opportunities in grades K-12. Students in AP African American History will be sharing historical facts with the high school community throughout the month. Celebrations on our calendar include some impressive Black Student Union (BSU) events. The BSU will be hosting a historical wax museum for students on the lower levels on February 7; and the BSU Read Aloud Week beginning February 12 when high school students will cross our campus to classrooms on the lower level and share multicultural literature with our younger students. We are pleased to invite all SSCPS families to celebrate at African Diaspora Night on March 7, 2024. We know we are at our best when we are together.

Annual Family Survey






