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AUGUST GREETINGS FROM SSCPS

Summer greetings to all of our students and families. We hope this email finds you enjoying the warm weather in anticipation of the upcoming school year. There's much to look forward to as we start to think about all of the excitement heading our way.

The new school year marks our 30th anniversary. As we established in 1995, our school community remains committed to our educational model of project-based learning combined with a college preparatory curriculum. Not only were we among the first group of charter schools in the Commonwealth, we were also one of the first to establish a dedication to service learning and community service that holds true today. Community service requirements are an important part of our exit standards at each grade level and we are proud of the work our students accomplish.

We see so many examples of student excellence every day. This summer was no exception. Last week we ran a week-long Math Acceleration Academy. In July we held the Extended School Year and Title III Literacy programs. This year we were thrilled to offer a

new opportunity for seventh and eighth graders, *The Language of Science: Summer Watershed Awareness Education Program* through a partnership with Cohasset Center for Student Coastal Research (CSCR), with support from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). During this new program, students were able to conduct water quality tests, debris analysis, and seagrass studies. It would seem that everywhere you look, student life at South Shore Charter empowers students to make an impact on the world around them.

As we approach our 30th year, it is clear that the South Shore Charter Public School has held fast to the institutional mission of inspiring every student to excel in academics, service, and life. We are fortunate to be granted federal, state, and private funding to maintain these wonderful summer learning programs and grateful for their partnership in our mission. Special thanks to all faculty and staff who made these programs possible, teaching classes, developing curricula, and chaperoning field trips. Special thanks to Laurie Hogan, Jamie Allen, Haley Edmondson, Jess Zutaut, Donika Darabus, and Jack Buckley from CSCR for planning meaningful summer learning experiences for our students.

Summer is also a terrific time to accomplish campus projects on our buildings and outside spaces. Our facilities team has worked hard to get the campus ready for those first days of school in August. This year, the facilities team has been busy painting, conducting electrical repairs, replacing flooring, updating the library, and landscaping. As always, we continue to maintain and monitor air quality in all of our classrooms and hallways to ensure a healthy and safe environment for students and staff.

Kindergarten Orientation will be Monday, August 26 at 100 Longwater Circle. Freshman Orientation for ninth grade students will be on Monday, August 26, at 700 Longwater Drive. Transportation services begin on the first day of school, Tuesday, August 27, 2024. Families will be receiving an email regarding transportation information and bus route updates in the upcoming days.

FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

If your student takes prescription medication during the school day, including epipens or inhalers, the medication will need to be dropped off to the school nurse by an adult. Medication cannot be sent on the bus with students. All medication needs to be

accompanied by a new prescription medication form each year. Your doctor may fill out their own medication form, an Asthma Action Plan, Allergy Action Plan, or the school's Prescription Drug Form. No medication can be accepted without the proper paperwork. Parents/guardians will also need to sign the form to give permission for medication to be administered in school. Students can not bring in over the counter medication. All medication needed at school must be held in the Health Office and have the proper paperwork in order for it to be administered at school. Please check expiration dates of medication before sending it in. Medication that expires during the school year will need to be replaced before it expires. Please reach out to your school nurse if you have any questions about medications.

If your student is planning on playing a school sport in the fall they must have a current physical dated within the past 13 months of the start of the sports season. Students who do not have a current physical will not be allowed to try out or participate in sports. You may submit health forms to:

Students entering K, 4th, 7th & 10th grade must submit current physical forms and vaccine records.

The K through 8 school is a **peanut/nut free** building. Please make sure you do not send your child to school with any food that contains peanuts or nuts or the label reads "may contain nuts or traces of nuts". Caffeinated beverages are not allowed in the elementary school. Please send your student to school with a reusable water bottle as the school does not provide water bottles.


Please reach out to your school nurse and teacher if your student is sick. Students who have vomiting, diarrhea, or a fever of 100 or above need to remain out of school until the symptoms or fever have resolved for 24 hours. If your student has strep throat, conjunctivitis or any other contagious illness they will need to remain out until they have been on antibiotics for 24 hours. Students who develop any of these symptoms during the school day will need to be picked up from school promptly. Please make sure your contact information with the school is up to date. Absences can be reported to attendance@sscps.org.

Level I students should have a full change of weather appropriate clothes that is kept at school.
