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#### A Message from Angie

It has been a busy spring at SSCPS! Students have concluded ELA MCAS testing across our campus, completed PSATs and SATs, and wrapped up the third quarter in grades 5-11. On Monday, Seniors shared their Civics Action Projects with teachers and with underclassmen at our Civics Action Project Showcase. First and second grade students have resumed their regular visits to <u>Holly Hill Farm</u>. Students across grades are hard at work on their final EOMs. We have entered the final stages of the school year.

While this time of year is always characterized by a flurry of activity, this year we are lucky to have more enrichment programming available for students than ever. This includes

additional field trips and a variety of assemblies and experiences for students at all Levels. Fourth grade students are engaged in a series of climate focused in-school workshops and off-site field trips through the educational arm of the <u>New England Wildlife Center</u>. Yesterday, sixth graders spent the day today at the <u>Plimoth Patuxet Museum</u>, a traditional Level II trip they missed due to COVID-19. Both our second graders and our fifth grade students conducted a curriculum-based lab experiment in school with a team from the <u>Center for the Advancement of STEM Education</u> at Bridgewater State University. Our eighth graders will be visiting the BSU campus for a college lab experience the week we return from break. Fifth graders visited the <u>USS Constitution Museum</u> last month and grade nine will visit next month.

Last week, Marlon Carey from <u>Rhode Island Black Storytellers</u> visited students in grades K-3. Marlon kept students at rapt attention with engaging, cross-cultural stories that included opportunities for student participation. On May 21st, the <u>Whalemobile</u> will pay a visit to our kindergarteners and first graders who will have the chance to pretend to eat, move, and breathe like whales in an experience that takes them both around the exterior and within the interior of the model whale with a marine educator.

These trips and experiences are by no means exhaustive and are in addition to the traditional field trips that our students have attended throughout the year. These additional experiences were partially made possible by grant funding from a variety of sources, but the bulk of these additional experiences are the result of the hard work of the Parents Association and the success of November's Raise Craze fundraiser. That funding has also helped cover some costs of our traditional field trips, keeping the cost reasonable. Under the leadership of Rachel Brodeur and Dawn Whitney the fall fundraising effort raised over

\$22,000 to support our school within an incredibly short timeline. The Parents Association has already begun planning for next year's fundraising efforts to ensure that we are able to sustain and build on this additional programming for our students. Stay tuned for information regarding this effort at the start of next school year.

With a late April vacation this year and an early end to the school year thanks to cooperative weather, we will return from the break with only seven weeks until the school year concludes. Those final days are busy with testing, field trips, concerts, awards ceremonies, field days, celebrations, and most importantly, graduation. With these events come many opportunities to volunteer. We are especially in need of help for Level I and Level II field day as those events are entirely parent run.






The last community fundraising opportunity this month is tomorrow at Ryan Family Amusements! Portions of food, beverage, and activity purchases will help support SSCPS students.

# **Careers in Medicine/Medical Research Workshop**

In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:

K-8: Jaime Kjelgaard (<u>Jkjelgaard@sscps.org</u>) High School: Barbara Folan (<u>Bfolan@sscps.org</u>) Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with

an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.


The following positions are open for next year:


