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A Message from Angie

While our school has seen our share of the illnesses that are spreading rampantly across the country over the past couple of weeks, the hard work of our teachers and students continues. Last week saw a celebration of the hundredth day of school as well as the first round of Exhibitions of Mastery for our Kindergarten students who shared nursery rhyme presentations with their peers. Students in grade five learned the science and math behind baking bread and then used bread baking kits to make bread to share in their communities. High school students are visiting lower level classrooms this week to share books celebrating Black History Month. First and second graders are bundling up to visit Holly Hill Farm for the annual winter walks that complement the fall and spring farm programs and facilitate the study of seasonal change.







With the arrival of February break, March is fast approaching and with it comes the start of the spring testing season. This month the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** released its school report cards for Massachusetts public schools and districts. The report card provides information from the state accountability system, bringing together a set of measures around school performance. Our accountability results are calculated using data from several sources including MCAS, English Learner progress, student attendance, high school completion, and enrollment in advanced coursework at the high school level. The DESE report card shows that our school is making substantial progress toward meeting the targets the state has set for us. Accountability percentiles (1-99) indicate how a school is performing overall compared to other schools with similar grade spans. Schools with higher percentiles are generally higher performing, and schools with lower percentiles are generally lower performing. This year our accountability percentile is 78 which means that overall, according to the accountability measures our school is performing better than 77% of middle/high or K-12 schools statewide.

MCAS results contribute significantly to DESE accountability determinations. Despite the changes that question two on November's ballot made to <u>Competency Determination</u> for graduation, public schools are still required to administer MCAS exams in grades 3-8 and at the high school level. MCAS exams are still an important measure of student progress that teachers use to determine necessary changes to the curriculum and supports for

students. All MCAS exams will be computer-based Next-Generation MCAS tests. Please find this spring's MCAS schedule below.



In other testing news, we will be administering an SAT exam to all Juniors on Friday, April 11th. Taking the exam in school provides students with the opportunity to take this important test in a comfortable environment with staff members they are familiar with. We will use this day to administer the PSAT 10 to the sophomore class and the PSAT 8/9 to students in grades 8 and 9. These exams provide teachers with important data as we plan interventions for students and adjust our curriculum. We will send out reminders as the date of these exams draws nearer.



Every donations makes a difference, no matter the size. Help us celebrate 30 years of SSCPS and contribute to our future successes for 30 more years and beyond!



Health Office

In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:

K-8: Jaime Kjelgaard (<u>Jkjelgaard@sscps.org</u>) High School: Barbara Folan (<u>Bfolan@sscps.org</u>) Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.
