At SSCPS, we see this village in action every day. It's in the way our Learning Services and

general education teachers work together to adapt lessons that meet each student's needs. It's in the small but impactful moments—when a paraprofessional quietly encourages a student to take a brave step toward independence, when a nurse provides the care that allows a student to focus on learning, and when a related service provider helps build the skills that open doors to new opportunities. The work of our entire staff, from classroom teachers to behind-the-scenes support professionals, creates the foundation that allows our students to grow, thrive, and step confidently into their futures.

Beyond our school doors, we are fortunate to have a growing number of supportive partners working with us to help our "village" expand. We are grateful to Best Buddies, Mass Hire, and Easterseals for all they provide for our students!

### **Expanding Friendships and Career Readiness**

Our Best Buddies program continues to be a cornerstone of these efforts. Through preemployment classes and our daily Workshop, the Best Buddies Friendship Program, students are not only gaining critical job skills but also developing the kind of friendships that foster confidence and a sense of belonging. These connections remind us that education isn't just about academics—it's about preparing students for the relationships, responsibilities, and resilience they'll need in life beyond high school.

#### **Building Pathways into the Trades**

We are also thrilled to provide new opportunities for seniors looking to enter the trades. Through a valuable partnership with Mass Hire and South Shore Technical, students interested in hands-on careers now have access to a training program that introduces them to skilled trades. Thanks to the continued support of Mass Hire, a grant has made it possible to fund the extras that truly make a difference for our students, helping to ensure that financial barriers don't stand in the way of their success. The collaboration between our school and industry partners reinforces the idea that it truly takes a network of people working together to provide meaningful opportunities for every student.

#### Hands-On Learning Beyond the Classroom

This fall, our transition students experienced a unique and powerful learning opportunity at the Bridge Center, run by Easterseals. Working with horses, they learned firsthand about teamwork, responsibility, and perseverance. These lessons extend far beyond the barn—the confidence, patience, and communication skills gained through this program will serve them well in any career path they choose.

#### A College Experience for Our Students

Looking ahead, our village is growing even wider. We are excited that our transition students have been invited to a special College Day event at Bridgewater State University



**Health Office** 

In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:

K-8: Jaime Kjelgaard (<u>Jkjelgaard@sscps.org</u>)

High School: Barbara Folan (**<u>Bfolan@sscps.org</u>**)

Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.
