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A Message from Angie

Now that the holiday break is behind us, we have entered a busy time for teaching and learning. Students and teachers are hard at work across our campus as the midpoint of the school year draws close. The second quarter ends for 5-12 students on Tuesday, January 21st. Our students in grades 7-12 are not only closing the second quarter but are also sitting for midyear exams. These exams are designed by teachers to test student progress in our curriculum and the results of these exams supply important data about student achievement. Students will complete exams in English, history, science, math, and world language. Students on Level IV will take their iReady Benchmark assessment in place of a traditional math exam. This allows us to use the extended testing time to gather important

data as we track student progress toward mastering grade-level skills.

While the midyears are an important measure of student achievement, they are also critical in helping students develop the study skills that they need in order to successfully complete exams at the college level. Students will go into the extended Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. weekend armed with study guides to help them prepare for their exams. Some students may need parental encouragement to take advantage of the study opportunity that the extended weekend presents.

Scores on midyear exams account for 10% of a student's final grade, a significant percentage. Knowledge of that significance is motivating for many students and spurs a healthy level of stress that drives achievement. We understand that for some students exams can cause excessive stress and anxiety. This is especially the case for our seventh grade students who are preparing for this type of exam for the first time and do not know what to expect. Taking the time necessary to prepare can help with the stress. If you are concerned about the level of stress your child is exhibiting, please reach out to their advisor or pod teacher so that we can provide support at school.

The schedule for midyear exams is below. All students in grades 7-12 will be dismissed at 12:00 pm on Wednesday, January 22nd, Thursday, January 23rd, and Friday, January 24th. Please prepare for pickup accordingly - students may be picked up following their exam(s), or they may remain at school to study and leave at the regularly dismissal time. There will be no half-day transportation provided on exam days. All Level IV students will be dismissed at the front door on those half days. On Friday, January 24th, high school students will be dismissed by 10:00 if they are not taking a make-up exam. Taking exams is exhausting for students. The early dismissal provides students with a well-deserved break. As a reminder, all students in grades K-6 must be met by an adult at the bus stop in the afternoon. If your K-6 child usually walks home with your older student, please plan for alternative arrangements on the midyear exam dates.

While exams and the end of the term focus our attention on academics, the social-emotional wellbeing of children is always at the forefront of our work at SSCPS. Next Thursday at 6:30pm, I will be running a virtual workshop for families that will cover the basics of bullying, cyberbullying, and conflict. The purpose of the workshop is to provide parents with tools to help them to identify, address, and prevent bullying and cyberbullying. I will also be covering the role of the school and providing some resources for parents. The content of the presentation is applicable to students in grades K-12. With the start of the new year, the daylight hours are slowly growing and spring is that much closer. In the meantime, I hope that you are all able to make the most of what is shaping up to be a real winter in New England. As always, please do not hesitate to reach out with questions or concerns.

Important Transportation Reminder
Pick Up & Drop Off Procedures

PICK UP + DROP OFF PROCEDURES

MORNING DROP OFF

- Cars dropping off should not enter the circle until 7:45.
- Please do not block the entrances to any of our neighbors' driveways while in the carline. Please allow them to enter and exit as needed.
- Please arrange to have students exit the cars on the passenger side.
- Drivers should not be leaving their cars to assist with student drop off, please allow the school staff to assist with this. If your child(ren) still needs assistance exiting the vehicle, please pull up as far to the side as you can to assist.
- Students should be dropped off at the front circle. Students should NOT be dropped off at the bus turn out along Longwater Circle. The only cars that should be utilizing that area are High School drivers dropping off their siblings or families that have made prior arrangements with school because of accessibility concerns.
- Cars exiting the school should be mindful of buses that also exit the school from the rear of the building. The stop sign at the end of the circle should be adhered to in order to check for outgoing buses.
- Please follow the instructions of the traffic attendant at the entrance of the school.

AFTERNOON PICK UP

- Cars should not be entering the circle until instructed to do so by Angie or the person checking in cars.
- Please do not block the entrances to any of our neighbors' driveway while in the carline. Please allow them to enter and exit as needed.
- Cars need to pull up as far as they can and wait until their child is instructed to go to the car.
- Please do not exit the vehicle to assist with putting your child in the car. If you need to help with a seatbelt or provide any other assistance please pull forward and provide that assistance.
- Please do NOT pick up your child at the bus turn out along Longwater Circle. Again, this is only to be utilized by High School drivers picking up siblings or families that have made prior arrangements because of accessibility concerns.

TRANSPORTATION CHANGES

- Please email transportation@sscps.org or call (781) 982-4202 extension 100 to report a transportation change for your child. It is critical that the school has this information so that bus lists are accurate. It is important that these changes be reported by 2pm. Please note that only registered bus riders may ride SSCPS school buses. Students must ride the bus to which they have been assigned. Please email transportation@sscps.org to request a change in bus route.

In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. **If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:**

Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.

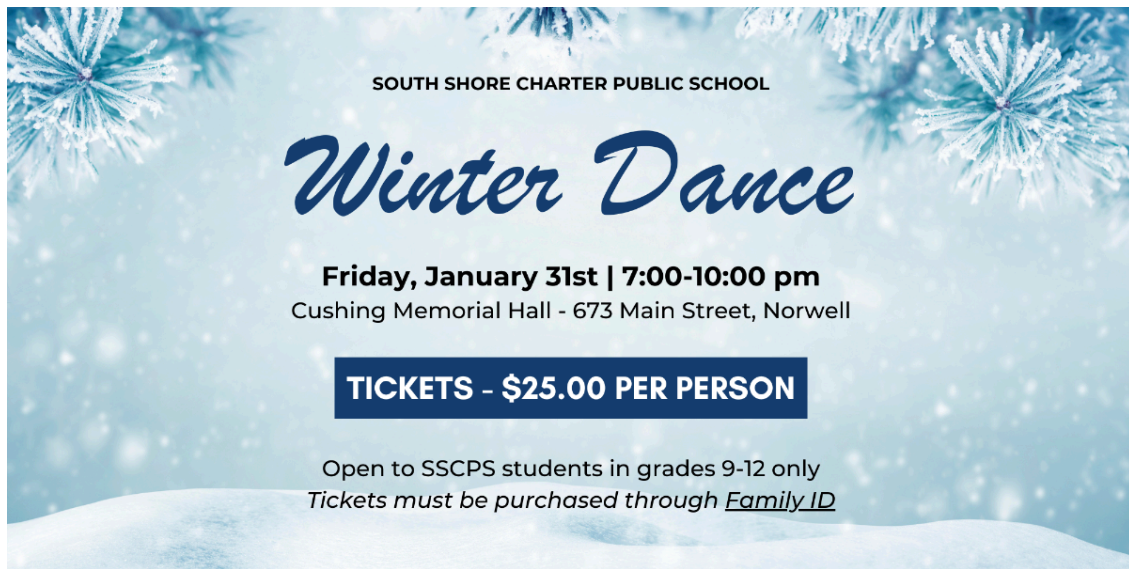

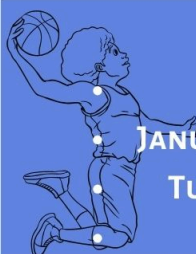
