Over the past few months, students have been working hard throughout their communities and reflecting on their experiences. Many of our students participated in the wonderful Raise Craze challenge in November. Year round, students have been recording their community service hours and reflecting on the importance of this work. It has been wonderful to read about our students as they work within their communities to make a difference. Whether it's volunteering at a public library, cleaning and cooking for the homeless, or helping an elderly neighbor garden, we remain perpetually proud of our students and all they have achieved in service and in life.

January is also that time of year when we ask our families about their South Shore Charter experience. The SSCPS Annual Family Survey is a pivotal tool to gain family insight. Over the past five years, family participation in the survey has been strong. Last year, participation in the Annual Family Survey reached an all-time high. We received survey results from 309 out of 688 families, boosting our response rate to 45%. We hope to achieve and surpass that high level of engagement this year. **We are asking each SSCPS family to participate in the survey** by reflecting on the first half of the academic year, as well as your overall SSCPS experience, to provide data essential to our institutional development.

Your feedback is invaluable as we strive for continuous improvement and work to provide the best possible educational experience for our students. Data collected from the survey is annually reviewed by the Instructional Leadership Team, the faculty and staff, and by the SSCPS Board of Trustees to assess key measures defining student achievement, institutional strength, and areas of growth. It is in this way that data collected will not only inform day-to-day enhancements, but will also play a crucial role in planning for the future.

Important Transportation Reminder **Pick Up & Drop Off Procedures**

Happy New Year! I hope everyone had a wonderful winter break and has had a smooth transition back into the school year. I wanted to take this opportunity to remind everyone of a few of the arrival and departure procedures in place to keep everyone safe and move traffic along as best as possible. Thank you all for helping us make the drop off and pick up as safe and enjoyable as possible.

PICK UP + DROP OFF PROCEDURES

MORNING DROP OFF

- Cars dropping off should not enter the circle until 7:45.
- Please do not block the entrances to any of our neighbors' driveways while in the carline. Please allow them to enter and exit as needed.
- Please arrange to have students exit the cars on the passenger side.
- Drivers should not be leaving their cars to assist with student drop off, please allow the school staff to assist with this. If your child(ren) still needs assistance exiting the vehicle, please pull up as far to the side as you can to assist.
- Students should be dropped off at the front circle. Students should NOT be dropped off at the bus turn out along Longwater Circle. The only cars that should be utilizing that area are High School drivers dropping off their siblings or families that have made prior arrangements with school because of accessibility concerns.
- Cars exiting the school should be mindful of buses that also exit the school from the rear of the building. The stop sign at the end of the circle should be adhered to in order to check for outgoing buses.
- Please follow the instructions of the traffic attendant at the entrance of the school.

AFTERNOON PICK UP

- Cars should not be entering the circle until instructed to do so by Angie or the person checking in cars.
- Please do not block the entrances to any of our neighbors' driveway while in the carline. Please allow them to enter and exit as needed.
- Cars need to pull up as far as they can and wait until their child is instructed to go to the car.
- Please do not exit the vehicle to assist with putting your child in the car. If you need to help with a seatbelt or provide any other assistance please pull forward and provide that assistance.
- Please do NOT pick up your child at the bus turn out along Longwater Circle. Again, this is only to be utilized by High School drivers picking up siblings or families that have made prior arrangements because of accessibility concerns.


TRANSPORTATION CHANGES

- Please email transportation@sscps.org or call (781) 982-4202 extension 100 to report a transportation change for your child. It is critical that the school has this information so that bus lists are accurate. It is important that these changes be reported by 2pm. Please note that only registered bus riders may ride SSCPS school buses. Students must ride the bus to which they have been assigned. Please email transportation@sscps.org to request a change in bus route.

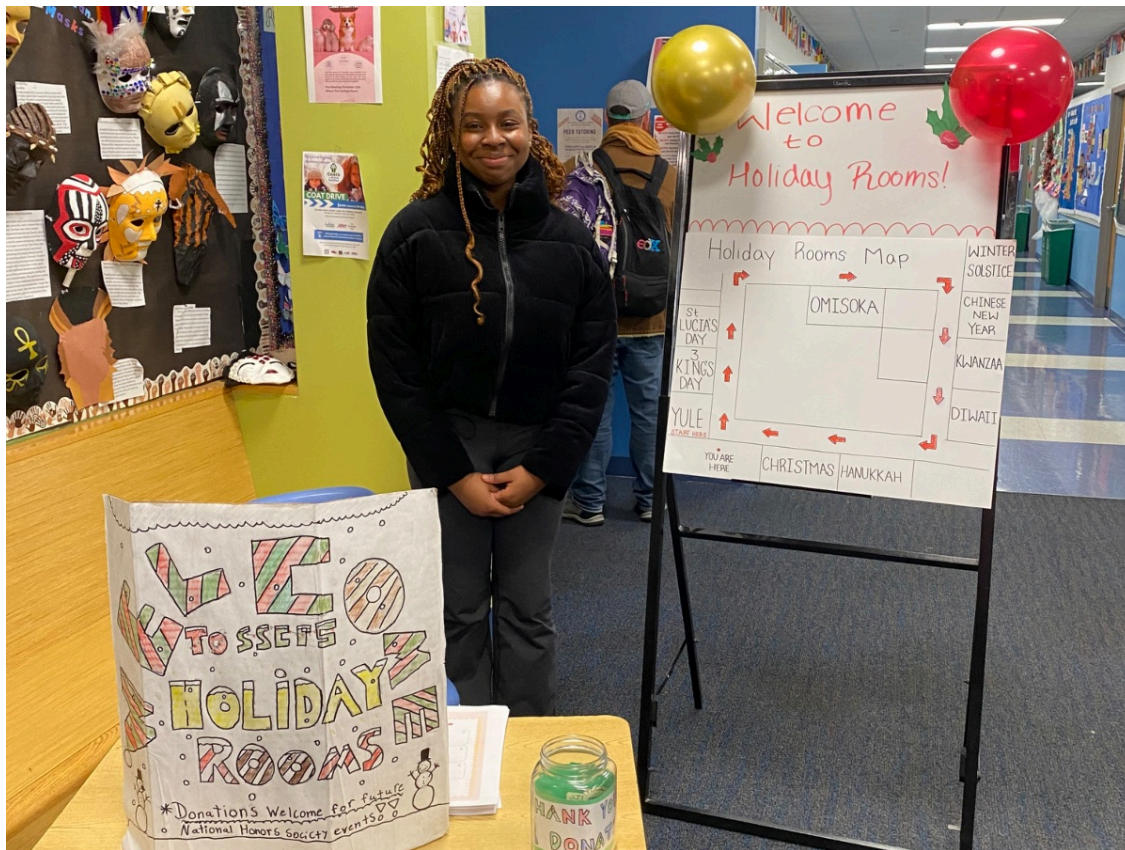
Handmade Winter Hats | Mariah's Pod

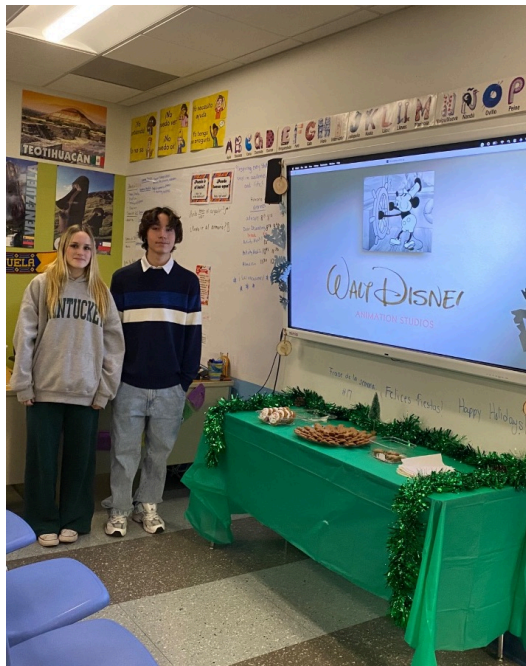


NHS Holiday Rooms

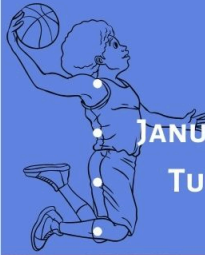

Health Office

If your student takes prescription medication during the school day, including epipens or inhalers, the medication will need to be dropped off to the school nurse by an adult. Medication cannot be sent on the bus with students. All medication needs to be accompanied by a new prescription medication form each year. Your doctor may fill out their own medication form, an Asthma Action Plan, Allergy Action Plan, or the school's [Prescription Drug Form](#). No medication can be accepted without the proper paperwork. Parents/guardians will also need to sign the form to give permission for medication to be administered in school. Students can not bring in over the counter medication. All medication needed at school must be held in the Health Office and have the proper paperwork in order for it to be administered at school. Please check expiration dates of medication before sending it in. Medication that expires during the school year will need to be replaced before it expires. Please reach out to your school nurse if you have any questions about medications.

If your student is planning on playing a school sport in the fall they must have a current physical dated within the past 13 months of the start of the sports season. Students who do not have a current physical will not be allowed to try out or participate in sports. You may submit health forms to:

Students entering K, 4th, 7th & 10th grade must submit current physical forms and vaccine records.

The K through 8 school is a **peanut/nut free** building. Please make sure you do not send your child to school with any food that contains peanuts or nuts or the label reads "may contain nuts or traces of nuts". Caffeinated beverages are not allowed in the elementary school. Please send your student to school with a reusable water bottle as the school does not provide water bottles.

Please reach out to your school nurse and teacher if your student is sick. Students who have vomiting, diarrhea, or a fever of 100 or above need to remain out of school until the symptoms or fever have resolved for 24 hours. If your student has strep throat, conjunctivitis or any other contagious illness they will need to remain out until they have been on antibiotics for 24 hours. Students who develop any of these symptoms during the

school day will need to be picked up from school promptly. Please make sure your contact information with the school is up to date. Absences can be reported to attendance@sscps.org.

Level I students should have a full change of weather appropriate clothes that is kept at school.

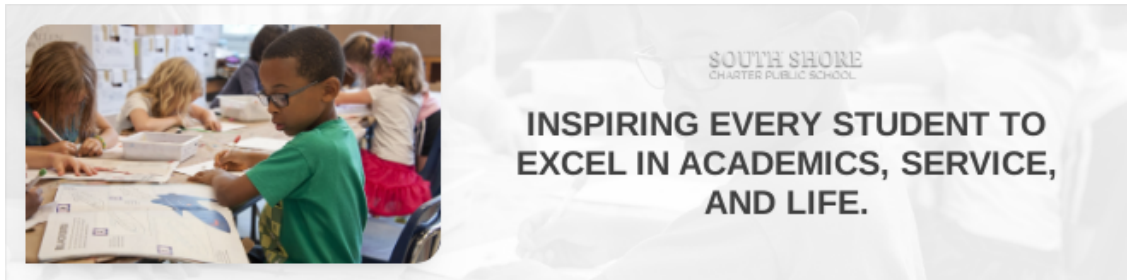
