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### A Message from Alicia

Teaching and learning are prolific in March. Students in grades K-4 have finished the second trimester of learning with the new iReady and Wonders curricula. Students in grades 8-10 are preparing for the PSAT on April 11. Seniors have completed Senior Debates, a three-day event that brought this talented group of students together in one room and one step closer to graduation. Looking to next year, students will soon begin selecting their courses.

Days here at South Shore Charter have become increasingly fast paced. As we leave the cold weather behind us, we are lifted by both warming days and thoughts of all that we

have yet to achieve. Last Thursday evening, the South Shore Charter Board of Trustees voted to move forward with a new student enrollment growth plan that would provide 225 additional seats over the next five years for students throughout the South Shore. The growth plan may be found in Table III on page 6 of the <u>Charter Amendment Request</u>. We are heartened by the realization of additional new classrooms and look forward to all that will be accomplished over the next six months.

We are grateful to the families who support our mission and institutional vision. We are fortunate to have continuously strong interest in our school throughout the South Shore. This year's enrollment season reminds us how our school's impact is widening. We received 787 applications for anticipated openings in kindergarten, Grades 1 and 2, Grades 7 and 8, and Grades 9 and 10. We remain grateful for our school community and our current families who have shared their experiences at the South Shore Charter Public School with others, spreading the word and supporting our mission.

The Enrollment Lottery was held on Friday, March 7, 2025. With 787 applications to be sorted, it remained a tremendous undertaking. The months leading up to Friday have been filled with admissions events and community outreach. Active recruitment of new families begins each November 1 for the upcoming school year. This year, we held an Enrollment Open House on November 14 at both buildings and received 248 visitors at 100 Longwater Circle and 71 visitors at 700 Longwater Drive. During "Talk to Us Tuesday" sessions in January and February, 78 prospective students and families were able to visit the campus while classes were in session and meet our students and teachers.


## **Grade 8 Fundraising Opportunities**

### **Health Office**

In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:

K-8: Jaime Kjelgaard (<u>Jkjelgaard@sscps.org</u>) High School: Barbara Folan (<u>Bfolan@sscps.org</u>) Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.
