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
A Message from Jamie

Dear SSCPS Families and Friends,

Myself, along with the middle school and high school science teachers, want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all the students, families, and friends of the SSCPS community for attending our first annual Family STEM Night on the eve of Pi Day! Your enthusiasm and participation made the event a memorable success.

Upon arrival, each student received a "Ticket to Adventure" along with a special pie token. As they completed each station, students were rewarded with a pie piece denoting the specific STEM branch they had explored. This added an exciting layer of game-like

engagement, encouraging students to collect their pieces as they made their way through the various activities.



Throughout the evening, students had the opportunity to explore various STEM fields through engaging hands-on activities. STEM, which stands for science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, encompasses a wide variety of disciplines and areas of focus. Teachers created stations that focused on Life Science/Biotechnology, Physical Science (Chemistry and Physics), Computer Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.

Our focus on mathematics included a coloring sheet on history of pi, where students created bracelets using the digits of pi. Students were also encouraged to stretch their imaginations and create unique pieces or branch out try their hands at binary code. In the physical science stations, participants went hands-first into the world of chemistry by making slime, crafting fake snow, and assembling molecules. Students also explored physics and electricity through interactive snap circuits, gaining a deeper understanding of how these concepts affect our everyday lives.

The engineering challenges were a hit, teaching students how to use the design and engineering process to solve a problem. Students used tinfoil to construct the tallest towers and designed boats capable of supporting the most weight while floating. These challenges allowed them to grasp the engineering process in a fun and creative way, all while having friendly competition.

In the life sciences and biotechnology area, students used microscopes to examine

prepared slides featuring specimens ranging from single-celled organisms to cross-sections of tissue samples. This hands-on exploration offered a glimpse into the fascinating world of biology. It allowed students to use common biotech equipment and to view the non-visible living world around them.

We also introduced our young tech enthusiasts to computer science with a variety of exciting stations! Students programmed Ozobots using color patterns and pathways that mirrored block code, experimented with micro:bits, and designed their own vinyl stickers using design software. Additionally, students were able to first hand see our 3D printing demonstrations, where they watched as objects came to life right before their eyes from single stranded plastic flimament to three dimensional, well-structured models

The success of Family STEM Night would not have been possible without your support and enthusiasm. We hope this event inspires our students to continue exploring the wonders of STEM in their everyday lives!

Thank you once again for joining us, and we look forward to more exciting events in the future!


Grade 8 Fundraising Opportunities



In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:

Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.
