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### A Message from the Board of Trustees

Dear SSCPS Community,

I hope this message finds you well. I am writing to remind you that the **Board of Trustees** will be voting on enrollment growth at our upcoming meeting tomorrow, Thursday, March 6th, at 5:30PM. This decision is a significant step in our school's future, and we encourage all members of our community to stay informed and engaged.

Records of the board's findings from the **December 4th and December 9th community meetings** are available in hard copy at the front desk and will be made digitally available after the board meeting.

For background, on **February 25th, 2025**, the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) Board of Education approved our charter amendment request to increase maximum enrollment. We were one of six charter schools seeking this approval, and our request was granted in a **6-4 vote**.

Looking ahead, if the SSCPS Board of Trustees approves this next step:


- March 7th, 2025 The newly approved seats will be included in the SSCPS Enrollment Lottery.
- April July 2025 SSCPS will work on building out additional space to accommodate the growth.
- August 1st, 2025 SSCPS will officially occupy the new space.

The next few months are always a critical period in our governance cycle, and this year is especially significant. Since the process began, the Board has engaged in thoughtful deliberation, carefully considering both the benefits and challenges of this decision. We invite you to join us as we reach the culmination of this collaborative process and continue to shape the future of SSCPS together.






## Staff Scrub Day | Friday, March 7th





























## **NHS Disability Awareness Fundraiser**

### **Chemical Creations Club**

#### "Hands-On Science: Exploring Plasma and Color Mixing"

This week, students engaged in two exciting hands-on experiments. They explored the fourth state of matter—plasma—by interacting with a plasma ball, observing its vibrant, electric colors in action. Then, through a creative color-mixing experiment using food dye and water, students discovered how primary colors blend to form new shades. Using droppers and test tubes, they honed their fine motor skills and were fascinated by how light enhanced the brilliance of their color creations. **Health Office** 

In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:

K-8: Jaime Kjelgaard (<u>Jkjelgaard@sscps.org</u>) High School: Barbara Folan (<u>Bfolan@sscps.org</u>) Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.
