May is Mental Health Awareness Month!

What is Mental Health?
"Mental health is a state of mental well-being that enables people to cope with the stresses of life, realize their abilities, learn well and work well, and contribute to their community. It is an integral component of health and well-being that underpins our individual and collective abilities to make decisions, build relationships and shape the world we live in. Mental health is a basic human right. And it is crucial to personal, community and socio-economic development."

Why is Mental Health Important in Schools?
Mental health is crucial in schools for several reasons, and it significantly impacts both students' well-being and academic performance. Here are a few key points on why it's so important:

- 1. Academic Success**
 - Mental health affects cognitive abilities, concentration, memory, and problem-solving skills. Students dealing with anxiety, depression, or other mental health challenges may struggle to focus or perform well academically, leading to poor grades and a lack of motivation.
- 2. Emotional Development**
 - School is an environment where young people learn how to manage their emotions, form relationships, and navigate social situations. Mental health

In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. **If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:**

Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.
