

Heart Health Screenings at SSCPS

Senior Emily Houghton has recently teamed up with the non-profit Who We Play For to hold heart screenings at SSCPS. Their shared goal is to reduce the rate of sudden cardiac death by finding detectable heart conditions that are easily found (95% of the time) on a student's EKG versus the 5% found in a normal sports or annual physical.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) is the leading cause of death on school campuses and the #1 killer of student-athletes, equaling what we believe may be as high as 23,000 SCA events each year - Emily's partnership with Who We Play For aims to provide accessible screenings for as many people as possible.





On the Levels

Brief History:

Passion twists were created in 2018 by Miami hairstylist Kailyn Rogers, known as The Boho Babe. She wanted to create a style that was lightweight, natural-looking, and a mix between goddess locs and Senegalese twists. Since then, passion twists have become very popular, especially within the Black community, because of their beauty and versatility.

Passion Twists

The Rising Popularity:

- Since their creation, Passion Twists have risen rapidly in popularity through social media platforms like Instagram and YouTube.
- They became a go-to protective style for people embracing their natural hair textures during the natural hair movement.
- Their soft, bouncy look makes them perfect for both casual and formal occasions.

In Entertainment:

- Celebrities like Cardi B, Beyoncé, and Janelle Monáe have rocked passion twists.
- They've appeared in music videos, red carpet events, and fashion campaigns.
- Passion twists symbolize the celebration of natural beauty in modern pop culture.

Fun Facts:

- They were inspired by the natural texture of Type 3 and 4 hair.
- Passion twists are considered a "protective style," helping natural hair grow while protecting it from damage.
- They can last 4-6 weeks with proper care.
- Passion twists are lighter and softer than traditional Malawi or Havana twists.

Description:

Passion twists are a protective hairstyle that combines the soft, bouncy texture of twists with the natural-looking feel of goddess locs. They are typically made by braiding natural hair with synthetic or natural hair extensions, creating a style that is both protective and versatile. The twists are usually 2-3 inches long and can be styled in various ways, from straight to curled. They are a popular choice for those looking to protect their natural hair while embracing a new look.



In the coming weeks, the Health Office will be starting screenings for vision, hearing, weight, and heights. These screenings are based on grades. **If you would like to exempt your student from any or all of these screenings please email:**

Exemptions must be done annually.

Please remember if your student has a fever, vomiting, diarrhea, or an infectious illness (such as strep throat) they need to remain out of school. Students with a fever need to remain home until they are fever free with no medication for 24 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea needs to be resolved for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Students with an infectious illness need to stay out until symptoms have resolved or they have completed a full 24 hours of antibiotics.

Students go outside for recess in most weather. Please make sure that students have proper clothing to be outside. Students should also have a refillable water bottle daily.

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
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
