A Message from Donika

It is another exciting year for mathematics at SSCPS. The K-8 mathematics department is equipped to begin the second year of the iReady math program. Students across grade levels have taken the iReady diagnostic, engaged in the math classroom structure, and are setting the foundation for becoming lifelong problem solvers. This comprehensive program places students at the forefront of their learning. Utilizing daily integrated learning routines, our teachers are empowered to lead students in discourse-driven instruction, enhancing their grasp of mathematical concepts. In its second year of implementation it is evident that teachers and students have grown comfortable with this type of math learning. Historical data now provides a starting point for teachers to address learning gaps and accelerate learning where appropriate.

The iReady program is set up with the "Try-Discuss-Connect" framework. This framework allows students to persevere in problem solving, evaluate one another's thinking, compare different mathematical representations and apply different strategies to their own thinking and work. Teachers are equipped to guide students through three types of lessons (understand lessons, strategy lessons, and math in action lessons) that are then divided into three types of sessions (explore, develop, and refine). Students will continue to learn program vocabulary that will enhance their mathematical understanding and will carry them through all K-8 grade levels and connect to the secondary level. Along with learning games, and assessments, diagnostics will be taken three times a year to assess student understanding and mathematical ability in comparison to grade level. These diagnostics are adaptive so question sets change depending on students' answers. Games are built in as "brain breaks" and scores are used to inform teacher planning and implementation. Diagnostic data provides targeted growth scores for each student and the end of year diagnostic will identify student success at meeting these goals. Diagnostic reports will be sent home after the middle and end of year assessments. Growth reports between assessments help to monitor progress.

At the High School level, the mathematics classroom is newly supported this year with the integral level of Delta Math. This program allows teachers to assign practice work and assessments to gather data to better inform their instruction. Students in Algebra 1 and Geometry began the year with a common diagnostic to help teachers better understand their mathematics level and placement.

Outside of the classroom students in grades K-8 have access to iReady's My Path, which is individualized based on the students diagnostic placement and students in grades 9-12

have access to practice assignments on Delta Math. Both of these tools serve as a supplement for students to build off of their prior knowledge and enhance the skills learned in the classroom. The best way to improve mathematical skills and performance is through practice and we are excited to build upon these resources to support our students.

6:40 - 7:00 | Classroom Visit 2


If you only have one child in grades K-4, the evening will end at 6:30.

Health Office

If your student takes prescription medication during the school day, including epipens or inhalers, the medication will need to be dropped off to the school nurse by an adult. Medication cannot be sent on the bus with students. All medication needs to be accompanied by a new prescription medication form each year. Your doctor may fill out their own medication form, an Asthma Action Plan, Allergy Action Plan, or the school's **Prescription Drug Form**. No medication can be accepted without the proper paperwork. Parents/guardians will also need to sign the form to give permission for medication. All medication needed at school must be held in the Health Office and have the proper paperwork in order for it to be administered at school. Please check expiration dates of medication before sending it in. Medication that expires during the school year will need to be replaced before it expires. Please reach out to your school nurse if you have any questions about medications.

Students entering K, 4th, 7th & 10th grade must submit current physical forms and vaccine records.

The K through 8 school is a **peanut/nut free** building. Please make sure you do not send your child to school with any food that contains peanuts or nuts or the label reads "may contain nuts or traces of nuts". Caffeinated beverages are not allowed in the elementary school. Please send your student to school with a reusable water bottle as the school does not provide water bottles.

Please reach out to your school nurse and teacher if your student is sick. Students who have vomiting, diarrhea, or a fever of 100 or above need to remain out of school until the symptoms or fever have resolved for 24 hours. If your student has strep throat, conjunctivitis or any other contagious illness they will need to remain out until they have been on antibiotics for 24 hours. Students who develop any of these symptoms during the school day will need to be picked up from school promptly. Please make sure your contact information with the school is up to date. Absences can be reported to **attendance@sscps.org**.

Level I students should have a full change of weather appropriate clothes that is kept at school.
