### **A Focus on the Importance of STEM and Opportunities in STEM**

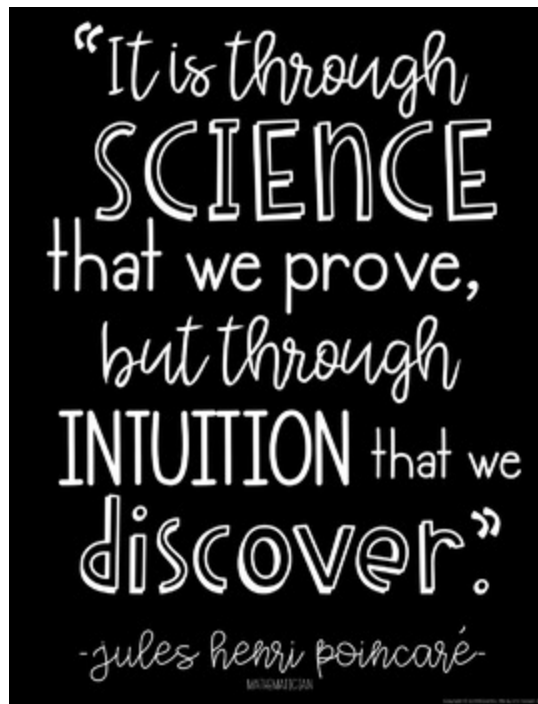
As we welcome a new year, we have many exciting new happenings within our science department at SSCPS. Teachers have eagerly welcomed our students and have been preparing a new year of science curriculum enriched with opportunities to be fully immersed in STEM. There are exciting new course happenings, additional FIT and Workshop opportunities, as well as new grant opportunities and partnerships.

The students in K-4 continue with teacher-developed lessons supplemented with hands-on activities and open and go lessons like that from Mystery Science and Simplify Science.

Our youngest students of the school on Level I continue to partake in the farm. In middle school, we are in full implementation of OpenSciEd. The mission of OpenSciEd is to support and power students to get excited and curious about the world around them and confident in their ability to figure it out through questioning, investigating, and solving problems. This aligns with the [MA Frameworks](#), as well as with the focus of our science department's instruction. Through generous grant funding through the One8 Foundation, teachers can attend professional development and funds can offset kit and consumable purchases.

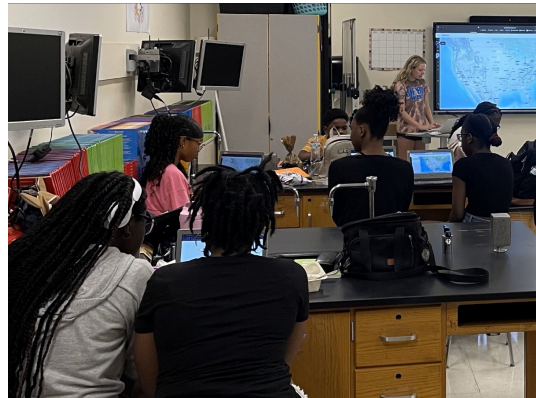
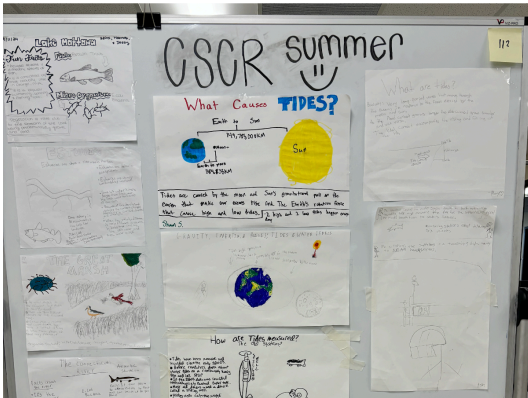
Our science curriculum here at SSCPS fosters an environment in which we let our students tap into their inquisitive nature. Our goal is to provide opportunities for our students to grow and develop as young scientists, as well as to practice the fundamental skills that are essential to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math). Adult supporters of students in the 6th-8th grade, please check out this [handout](#) containing information about supporting your student while they embark on the OpenSciEd journey. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education is developing an innovative science assessment for grades 5 and 8 that uses a new type of performance task for students. Students engage with meaningful problems through interactive computer simulations to conduct investigations, create and explore models, and solve science or engineering challenges. Our students in grades 3-8 will complete paper based tasks that will prepare them for these assessment changes.

STEM education goes beyond the school subjects and what happens in the classroom. It fosters the development of a skill set that goes beyond our learning, and it governs the way we think and behave. STEM education, which encompasses science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, helps us to problem solve. STEM is not only important to our everyday lives, it is also important for the future of our children in that the skills they will master along the way will make them more college and career ready. These experiences and skills are not just necessary in their education, but also in making them more prepared to face the problems of the world today. Each component of STEM is important to a well-rounded education and it brings certain value with it. Science provides us with an understanding of the world around us. It teaches us to be better at problem solving, research, and critical thinking. Technology exposes us to innovations. Engineering enhances problem solving skills while also teaching us how to apply them. Math teaches us to analyze information, to deter from error, and to construct well-thought out solutions. STEM is our future as we look to solve the world's problems and transform society with innovation and creative solutions.



There are several new partnerships that will provide students with STEM opportunities. Through the CS Engage grant and the Citadel grant, we have been able to expand our computer science programming for our students grades 6-12. Grant funding awarded from the Massachusetts Life Science Center will allow us to expand on programming and experiences for students so that they can develop skills necessary to prepare for a career in the life sciences. This year we will work to expand upon our partnership with the Cohasset Center for Student Coastal Research (CSCR) and NOAA so that we can create sustainable programming for our students that will allow them to experience Marine Science in action, as well as participate in meaningful watershed education and field based research.

The mission of CSCR is to engage youth in the civic and scientific study of the local watershed and marine environment to inspire stewardship of our planet's ecosystems. This past summer, 20 students from grades 7 and 8 participated in a field based experience in which they became environmental stewards of our local watershed ecosystems. Through a blend of classroom instruction and field-based learning experiences, students developed a holistic understanding of the ocean's impact on our lives. Through field observation, sediment sampling, water quality testing, float deployment and debris analysis, students investigated the human footprint on our watershed and developed a heightened awareness of environmental stewardship. This partnership will continue to allow our students to make meaningful connections to our global ocean and the importance of protecting this valued resource. We look forward to continuing this partnership and providing opportunities for our students.

## Health Office

If your student takes prescription medication during the school day, including epipens or inhalers, the medication will need to be dropped off to the school nurse by an adult. Medication cannot be sent on the bus with students. All medication needs to be accompanied by a new prescription medication form each year. Your doctor may fill out their own medication form, an Asthma Action Plan, Allergy Action Plan, or the school's

**Prescription Drug Form**. No medication can be accepted without the proper paperwork. Parents/guardians will also need to sign the form to give permission for medication to be administered in school. Students can not bring in over the counter medication. All medication needed at school must be held in the Health Office and have the proper paperwork in order for it to be administered at school. Please check expiration dates of medication before sending it in. Medication that expires during the school year will need to be replaced before it expires. Please reach out to your school nurse if you have any questions about medications.

If your student is planning on playing a school sport in the fall they must have a current physical dated within the past 13 months of the start of the sports season. Students who do not have a current physical will not be allowed to try out or participate in sports. You may submit health forms to:

Students entering K, 4th, 7th & 10th grade must submit current physical forms and vaccine records.

The K through 8 school is a **peanut/nut free** building. Please make sure you do not send your child to school with any food that contains peanuts or nuts or the label reads "may contain nuts or traces of nuts". Caffeinated beverages are not allowed in the elementary school. Please send your student to school with a reusable water bottle as the school does not provide water bottles.

Please reach out to your school nurse and teacher if your student is sick. Students who have vomiting, diarrhea, or a fever of 100 or above need to remain out of school until the symptoms or fever have resolved for 24 hours. If your student has strep throat, conjunctivitis or any other contagious illness they will need to remain out until they have been on antibiotics for 24 hours. Students who develop any of these symptoms during the school day will need to be picked up from school promptly. Please make sure your contact information with the school is up to date. Absences can be reported to [attendance@sscps.org](mailto:attendance@sscps.org).

Level I students should have a full change of weather appropriate clothes that is kept at school.

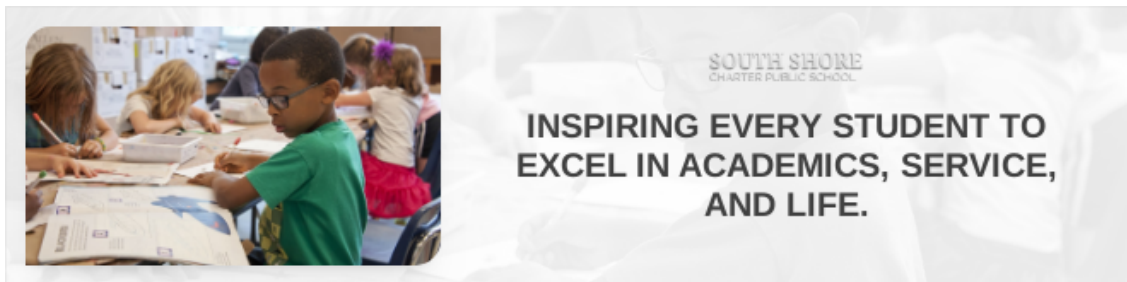
