A Message from Angie

December is here and with it comes the blur of events and celebrations that help us close out the calendar year at SSCPS. The next two and half weeks will go by quickly with many classroom events planned as well as two <u>Winter Concerts</u>, a Night of Code, the Holiday Rooms event, Parent-Teacher Conferences, Craft Day, and the BSU's <u>Kwanzaa Night</u> on the horizon.

Our faculty is looking forward to collaborative meetings with families during Parent Teacher Conferences next Friday, December 12th. Appointments for students in grades K-4 should be scheduled directly with the teacher. If your child is in grades 5-12 use this to schedule appointments. You must first register by clicking "Click Here to Register." More detailed instructions can be found here.

Conferences are an important opportunity to connect with your child's teachers and learn about their academic progress, social-emotional development, and ways you can support their learning at home. Before the conference, I encourage you to talk with your child about how they feel about school. Ask if there are questions they would like you to bring to the teacher. Review their work and grades, noting any patterns, concerns, or areas that seem inconsistent with what you see at home. Preparing your questions ahead of time can help you make the most of the meeting. Because conference time is brief, focus on information you can't easily gather from a report card. It is also helpful to share a concise update about any relevant circumstances or changes at home that may be affecting your child's experience at school.

During the conference, your child's teacher will provide a professional perspective that may differ from what you observe at home. Listen carefully to their feedback, even if some of it is difficult to hear. Don't hesitate to ask for clarification on any academic terms,

acronyms, or programs. If concerns arise about behavior or academics, ask for concrete examples (e.g., "Can you share an example of when they had trouble following directions?"). Please plan to arrive on time, and for virtual conferences, ensure your technology is working prior to the meeting. Conferences are tightly scheduled, and teachers want to use the full time to focus on your child.

On the afternoon of Friday, December 19th our K-6 students will participate in Craft Day. This highly anticipated, long standing SSCPS tradition allows students to celebrate the season by creating a number of crafts to keep or to gift. We are looking for volunteers to assist with crafts in our classrooms and for donations of craft materials. If you are interested in volunteering on Craft Day or in providing a craft, please sign up here. We are asking volunteers to plan for a craft for about 50 students. Anyone that volunteers at SSCPS must complete a CORI, complete volunteer training, take the volunteer quiz and be fingerprinted. Please plan ahead and get your paperwork completed as soon as possible if you plan to come in and volunteer on Craft Day. This sign up will close on Friday, December 12th to allow us time to plan.

Protocol for absences, tardiness and dismissing students early:

SSCPS Volunteer Information

We know that many parents and guardians are eager to complete volunteer requirements so that they are able to begin volunteering. Please find the list of volunteer requirements below. Links to the required documents are available on the volunteering_page on our website. Copies of the paperwork will be available prior to the Back-to-School Nights.

Anyone who is working with children or within our SSCPS buildings must be officially registered as a volunteer. This policy is in place to protect our students. Volunteers must register each school year. In order to register as a volunteer, you must complete all of the requirements listed below.

- Complete a CORI form. This requirement must be met annually. The CORI form should be returned to the school to the attention of Pam Algera with a copy of a photo ID.
- Complete Identogo Fingerprinting. This task must be completed every three
 years. Fingerprinting is completed off site and has a cost. SSCPS will reimburse
 parent/guardian volunteers for this cost.
- Complete Volunteer Training and agree to the Confidentiality Policy. This
 requirement must be completed every three years. The training is available on the
 volunteering page on our website.

From the Dean's Desk

This week, our advisory work continues the conversation we started earlier about online communication. Over the past few months, we've seen how quickly group chats can pull students into drama, misunderstandings, and hurt feelings. Even when the conflict starts outside of school, it finds its way into our classrooms and hallways.

Our goal is not to police every message students send. Our goal is to teach them how to pause, think, and make choices that keep themselves and others safe.

In advisory, teachers will guide students through a short lesson on how to stay calm and responsible in group chats. They will talk through what usually goes wrong, what helps things de-escalate, and what actions students can take when a chat becomes negative.

The focus is simple: slow down, don't add fuel, step away when needed, and ask an adult for help when something crosses a line.

These are skills students need now. They're also skills they will need for the rest of their lives.

As always, your partnership matters. If you notice online tension at home, please let us know. When we work together, we give our students the structure they need to navigate digital spaces with more care.

Monday, December 8th from 5-6:30PM



From the Health Office

Important Reminders | 2025-2026

If your student takes prescription medication during the school day, including epipens or inhalers, the medication will need to be dropped off to the school nurse by an adult. Medication cannot be sent on the bus with students. All medication needs to be accompanied by a new prescription medication form each year. Your doctor may fill out their own medication form, an Asthma Action Plan, Allergy Action Plan, or the school's Prescription Drug Form. No medication can be accepted without the proper paperwork. Parents/guardians will also need to sign the form to give permission for medication to be administered in school. Students can not bring in over the counter medication. All

medication needed at school must be held in the Health Office and have the proper paperwork in order for it to be administered at school. Please check expiration dates of medication before sending it in. Medication that expires during the school year will need to be replaced before it expires. Please reach out to your school nurse if you have any questions about medications.

If your student is planning on playing a school sport in the fall they must have a current physical dated within the past 13 months of the start of the sports season. Students who do not have a current physical will not be allowed to try out or participate in sports. You may submit health forms to:

Students entering Kindergarten, 4th, 7th, or 10th Grade must submit current physical forms and vaccine records.

The K through 6 school is a **peanut/nut free** building. Please make sure you do not send your child to school with any food that contains peanuts or nuts or the label reads "may contain nuts or traces of nuts". Caffeinated beverages are not allowed in the elementary school. Please send your student to school with a reusable water bottle as the school does not provide water bottles.

Please reach out to your school nurse and teacher if your student is sick. Students who have vomiting, diarrhea, or a fever of 100 or above need to remain out of school until the symptoms or fever have resolved for 24 hours. If your student has strep throat, conjunctivitis or any other contagious illness they will need to remain out until they have been on antibiotics for 24 hours. Students who develop any of these symptoms during the school day will need to be picked up from school promptly. Please make sure your contact information with the school is up to date. Absences can be reported to attendance@sscps.org.

Level I students should have a full change of weather appropriate clothes that is kept at school.
