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A Message from Alicia

As October comes to a close, and the shortening November days encroach, we welcome the almost-winter time. Dusk settles in closer and closer to afternoon dismissal, daylight hours dwindle, and yet, we are brightened by the steady score of traditions that have lasted through time. Here on campus, those may be found every day. Whether it's an eventful Level I PE class on the hill, or a quiet reading lesson on Level II, or the annual thrill of pumpkin carving on Level III, we remain grateful for the patterns of progress that teaching and learning provide.

We are pleased to announce that enrollment season begins on November 1. For those of you new to our school community, this is the time of year when we showcase all that a South Shore Charter education encompasses. Applications for the 2026-2027 school year will be available on our website on Saturday. For our current families, siblings of current students seeking admission must complete an application and participate in the Enrollment Lottery.

Enrollment Open House for new students and prospective families will be on November 20 from 5:00pm - 7:00pm. We are hosting the Open House at two locations, 100 Longwater Circle and 700 Longwater Drive. Registration for Open House also opens on Saturday. Although current students do not need to reapply, we encourage Level IV students to come and visit the high school to learn more about student life and our comprehensive academic programs.

We are grateful to our students, families, and teachers. Despite statewide enrollment trends, our waitlist has remained extensive and steady. Each year, the number of applications we receive exceeds the number of openings we have. We attribute this persistent strong interest in our school to those of you in our school community who spread the word about our school and mission. Year after year, your words describing what a South Shore Charter education has meant to you and your family have proven invaluable.

From the Food Services Department

SSCPS Families,

As of this week, the federal government will not to be using contingency funds to pay for November SNAP benefits. Therefore, effective Saturday, November 1, over 1 million residents, including 277,000 school aged children in 168,000 households, will not receive their SNAP benefits. Seemingly, SNAP benefits will not continue to be paid until the federal government shutdown is over.

The South Shore Charter Public School offers free nutritious lunch and breakfast at school every school day for all students. Please visit our <u>Food Services</u> webpage to learn more about our FREE NSLP breakfast and lunch programs and to place an order for your child. If you haven't already, you are able to order your child's meals online. All families must register each child in Arbiter. Please visit the <u>SSCPS FamilyId Programs</u> webpage to register your child. When registering your child for meals please be sure to

input their grade. Their student ID and homeroom teacher **are not** required fields. If you do know their homeroom teacher it would be helpful but that information can always be entered at a later time. 

SSCPS Volunteer Information

We know that many parents and guardians are eager to complete volunteer requirements so that they are able to begin volunteering. Please find the list of volunteer requirements below. Links to the required documents are available on the <u>volunteering page on our</u> <u>website</u>. Copies of the paperwork will be available prior to the Back-to-School Nights.

Anyone who is working with children or within our SSCPS buildings must be officially registered as a volunteer. This policy is in place to protect our students. Volunteers must register each school year. In order to register as a volunteer, you must complete all of the requirements listed below.

- 1. **Complete a CORI form.** This requirement must be met annually. The CORI form should be returned to the school to the attention of Pam Algera with a copy of a photo ID.
- 2. **Complete Identogo Fingerprinting.** This task must be completed every three years. Fingerprinting is completed off site and has a cost. SSCPS will reimburse parent/guardian volunteers for this cost.
- 3. Complete Volunteer Training and agree to the Confidentiality Policy. This requirement must be completed every three years. The training is available on the volunteering <u>page on our website</u>.

From the Dean's Desk

Dear Families,

This week in Advisory, our students are exploring collaboration and leadership — two skills that matter just as much as academics.

At Charter, we remind students that leadership isn't about being the loudest or the one in charge. Real leadership is about listening, noticing what the group needs, and helping others succeed. It's about stepping forward when it's time to guide — and stepping back when it's time to make space.

When collaboration is working well, it looks simple from the outside: everyone contributing, things moving forward, people feeling heard. But underneath that calm surface are all the small, unseen choices — listening, adjusting, encouraging — that turn a group of individuals into a team. Those are the skills our students will use for the rest of their lives, whether in a classroom project or someday in their workplaces and families.

This week's advisory gives students a chance to practice those habits in real time. They'll take on specific roles — facilitator, timekeeper, materials manager, recorder — and work together on a group challenge. The goal isn't to "win," but to learn how to build something together.

As adults, we model these same lessons every day. The way we collaborate, the way we handle differences, and the way we give credit — all of that teaches more than we realize.

When our students see adults treating each other with patience and respect, it becomes the standard they rise to meet.

Charter's strength has always been its people. Each of us brings something different to the table, and when we work together, we show students what community really looks like — not a perfect one, but one that keeps showing up, listens well, and gets better together.





Back to School | 2025-2026

If your student takes prescription medication during the school day, including epipens or inhalers, the medication will need to be dropped off to the school nurse by an adult. Medication cannot be sent on the bus with students. All medication needs to be accompanied by a new prescription medication form each year. Your doctor may fill out their own medication form, an Asthma Action Plan, Allergy Action Plan, or the school's Prescription Drug Form. No medication can be accepted without the proper paperwork. Parents/guardians will also need to sign the form to give permission for medication to be administered in school. Students can not bring in over the counter medication. All medication needed at school must be held in the Health Office and have the proper paperwork in order for it to be administered at school. Please check expiration dates of medication before sending it in. Medication that expires during the school year will need to be replaced before it expires. Please reach out to your school nurse if you have any questions about medications.

If your student is planning on playing a school sport in the fall they must have a current physical dated within the past 13 months of the start of the sports season. Students who do not have a current physical will not be allowed to try out or participate in sports. You may submit health forms to:

Students entering Kindergarten, 4th, 7th, or 10th Grade must submit current physical forms and vaccine records.

The K through 6 school is a **peanut/nut free** building. Please make sure you do not send your child to school with any food that contains peanuts or nuts or the label reads "may contain nuts or traces of nuts". Caffeinated beverages are not allowed in the elementary school. Please send your student to school with a reusable water bottle as the school does not provide water bottles.

Please reach out to your school nurse and teacher if your student is sick. Students who have vomiting, diarrhea, or a fever of 100 or above need to remain out of school until the symptoms or fever have resolved for 24 hours. If your student has strep throat, conjunctivitis or any other contagious illness they will need to remain out until they have been on antibiotics for 24 hours. Students who develop any of these symptoms during the school day will need to be picked up from school promptly. Please make sure your contact information with the school is up to date. Absences can be reported to attendance@sscps.org.

Level I students should have a full change of weather appropriate clothes that is kept at school.
