## Alicia, Executive Director

Thank you to the PA for funding the "No Cell Phone" signs that were recently installed Board of Education Update - SSCPS put forth an amendment to increase the number of slots at our school. This was ap-proved by the Board of Ed. Reason for the request was to expand the High School to 200 students ( 50 per grade). This will help to increase offering of AP and Honors classes as well as extracurricular activities. Will start expanding at the upcoming lottery - 2012 lottery will increase by 16,2014 lottery will increase by 19, 2015 lottery will increase by 14, 2016 lottery will increase by 9 and 2017 lottery will increase by 5 . After the 2017 lottery our school will have 602 students enrolled. Brief $Q$ \& $\boldsymbol{A}$ Q - How will we keep the current students to stay for high school?
