## School Reports

### *Alicia Savage, Executive Director*

**January Open House:** very well attended. Thanks to PA – especially Maureen Hebert – and the volunteer students and parents who all did a great job giving tours, answering questions and “selling” our school to prospective parents.

**February 8:** Several things happening this day:

**Early Dismissal** – Staff will be working on data from formative assessments to inform instruction going forward. There is a positive outlook for MCAS. Parents should continue doing the support work they are doing at home – it’s working!

**Letters of Intent due** – Grade Reps please get the word out

**Enrollment Applications due 5pm** – For new parents \*and\* for current families applying for siblings for next year.

**Enrollment Lottery:** Saturday February 11 (9am or 10am?)

**Annual Fund:** February challenge. Anonymous donor of \$5,000 matching funds. Every \$1 donated will get matched by this donor up to \$5,000.

**TERI College Planning:** Tuesday February 7 4:30-6pm, for parents and students. Part of the work the school does to help families/students through the college planning/application/finances process organized by Mary Carter and Angie Pepin. FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) came last week. The process is a huge challenge, involves lots of writing for funding, scholarships etc. It’s like an extra part-time job for students to do everything required.

### *Ted Hirsch, K-6 Principal*

**Sibling Enrollment Applications:** Please, please remind families to get applications in by February. Siblings cannot be considered if the applications are not submitted.

**Formative assessments:** The second batch of formative assessments showed significant progress. The school is cautiously optimistic that we can meet AYP in MCAS this year. Teachers will be making adjustments in instruction based on these results. For the first time the school is tracking these results by subgroup as well as by individual and group, in order to mirror the how the State breaks down scores.

**Level I MFA Field Trip:** As always our kids were great! We’re only one of 2 schools allowed to take 1<sup>st</sup> Graders to the MFA.

**Improving Behavior:** Now that the stress of Holidays and the darkest Quarter of the year are over, students’ behavior has improved and everyone is settling down again.

**Level II maternity leave:** Krista will continue to work at least until February school vacation week. Kristin Waldron will be Acting Level Coordinator during Krista’s maternity leave.

**Grade Reports****Kindergarten**

FAFSA – students should begin to think about this in 9<sup>th</sup> Grade. Should take SAT practice. MIT does prep courses for \$100. Not expensive. Excellent course offered every 6 months at weekends. Also HSSP – HS Summer program. Look into scholarships etc. in Sophomore year. Relieves the stress of Junior and Senior year.

There was a general discussion about our culture of college, how students are prepared for a college experience etc. Parents from lower grades were appreciative of the discussion. It helps us to remember that we're a K-12 school. Talking about college as an educational goal should be encouraged at the lower levels. Many parents unaware of our HS requirements for example.

Lisa: the PA needs to get back to the idea first suggested over the summer of creating Level Guides with the school so parents can access a lot of this information.

Kerry: Can we bring the HS to the lower levels for example in Town Meeting?

## New Business

### *Dining for a Cause*

There was a discussion for how the PA should spend the funds raised through the monthly restaurant drives.  
There was strong support for the money to be used to pay for fresh fruit in the after school program.  
**Motion Proposed:** Money raised through the Dining for a Cause program should be added to the PA's current allocation and included in the PA grant award system. Proposed by Kerry. Seconded by Priscilla Kelly.

### *Annual Fund*

Lisa distributed the new glossy flyer with participation by grade level broken out. (See attached)  
Parent participation has increased from 18% to 28% since December.  
PA Officials participation has increased from 47% to 76% in that time. We have to get to 100%!  
Kerry organized a Level II social that raised funds for Annual Fund.  
Debbie and Iris said they would run the Level I & II Social.

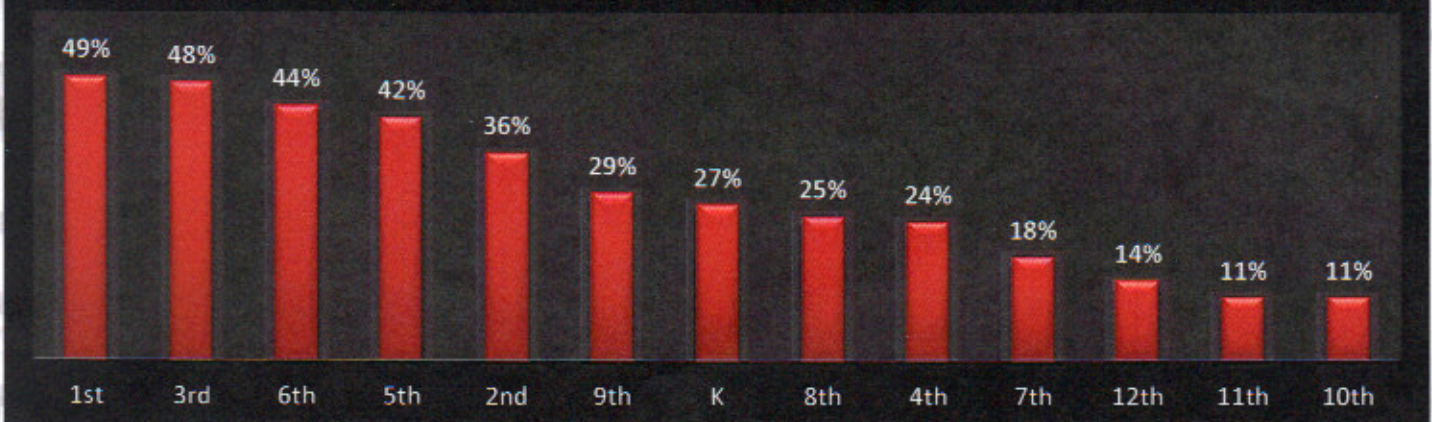

The North River Arts Society is pleased to announce that Scituate Federal Savings Bank has pledged to support financial assistance scholarships for students (grades 1 - 12) to apply toward registration for NRAS classes.
