## School Reports

## Alicia, Executive Director

Enrollment Lottery took place on Saturday, February 11. There were 536 applications for 37 slots.
Accepted 30 into kindergarten ( 21 siblings and 9 new families), 3 into $9^{\text {th }}$ grade and 4 into $11^{\text {th }}$ grade.
Applications received is broken down as follows: Kindergarten - 171, First - 52, Second - 40, Third - 42, Fourth - 47, Fifth -41 , Sixth -45 , Seventh -32 , Eighth -14 , Ninth -38 , Tenth -10 , Eleventh -4
Auction - March 30. Volunteers are working very hard to pull this together.
Q - Why only 30 spots for Kindergarten?
A - We can have 540 students total allowed in school. There will be some turnover where kids will not return next year. We will fill all spots but are waiting to see how many spots open in each grade. We will have more than 30 kindergartners, but may not have 44.
Q - How are ticket sales for the Auction?
A - They are rolling in. Order before Saturday to get discounted price of $\$ 25 / \mathrm{pp}$. After Saturday it will be $\$ 30 / \mathrm{pp}$.
