Other Definitions and Explanations:

Back to School Night: Parents go through their student's schedule

Senior Parent Night: Night for students and parent hosted by guidance to go over expectations and timeline for Senior Year.

Senior Retreat: Senior overnight at Camp Burgess, MA sponsored by SSCPS. This is typically the 3rd Thursday –Friday in September. This is a community building event.

Letters of Recommendation: All students are required to have 2 letters of recommendation. Letters of recommendation should be from a high school teacher that the student has had in their Junior and/or Senior year.

There is also a School Counselor (Guidance) Recommendation letter.

Early Action (EA): Students apply to schools by Nov 1 or Nov 15 (Round 1) or Dec 1 or Dec 15 (Round2) Students will be notified by January about their acceptance. This is a non-binding decision and students can apply to as many schools as they want Early Action.

Early Decision(ED): Students apply early to one school as Early Decision because if the student gets admitted Early Decision, they must withdraw all other applications and commit to the ED school.

Regular: Regular application deadline starts Jan 1 and Jan 15th. May MA State Colleges and Universities are Jan 15 or Feb 15

FAFSA: Free Application for Federal Financial Aid – this is a <u>free</u> financial application that all students must complete to be eligible for: Merit Scholarship, Pell Grant, Perkins Loan, Student Loans, Work Study.

CSS Profile: Financial Aid form used by many private colleges – check to see f the colleges you are applying to require the CSS Profile. There is a cost of \$25.00 to complete. For more information - http://css.collegeboard.org/

Massasoit 'On the Spot Admissions'' Event – Admission representative from Massasoit will come in, review their applications, and have a admission decision that day.



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Deposit Day – May 1st This is the universal deposit day for most colleges.

AP Exams : AP Exams are always the first 2 weeks of May.

<u>Senior Events</u> Senior Finals: These are final exams for seniors.

Senior Debates: All Seniors are required to take Ethics and participate in a debate.

Senior Project: Seniors spend the last 3 weeks of school on a Senior Project (Internship). The internships are 30 hours per week (which is similar to the time they would spend in school), the interns are unpaid, and can be in a wide range of areas. In the past, students have interned at: Daycares, Elementary schools, Holly Hill Farm, Weir River Farm, local Town Government agencies, libraries, and businesses.

Senior Presentations: Seniors present their internship experience to the high school students.

<u>Senior Dinner</u>: Dinner for students, parents, and teachers. This is typically scheduled the Thursday before graduation.
